AUSTIN - A sprig of mistletoe tacked above the doorway at Christmastime is a good excuse for stealing a kiss, the Texas Safety Association noted today, but warned homemakers that there's a potential danger in having mistletoe and some other Christmas plants around the home.

Although it is not commonly known, the waxy - white, sticky mistletoe berry is highly poisonous and fatal if swallowed, the Safety Association pointed out. Adults as well as children have died from tasting these harmlesslooking berries.

But mistletoe is not the only poisonous Christmas plant. The leaves of the poinsettia can also be deadly if eaten and one leaf can be enough to kill a child.
