Also, the board voted to have a school board member sign payroll checks with the school bookkeeper.

Train Almost Derails

A Santa Fe passenger train was almost derailed in Bovina Sunday afternoon.

The near-wreck was apparently caused by vandals who placed scraps of iron on the track on the east side of Bovina, near the Holly Sugar Beet loading location, according to City Marshal Bill Denney and E. A. Nelson of Amarillo, division special agent for the railway company.

The objects on the tracks caused two units of the five-unit engine to uncouple, Nelson said. The train crew noticed what they thought to be pieces of scrap metal before the front engine struck them.

The train was delayed 17 minutes while it stopped to recouple.

The near-accident occurred about 5 p.m.

"Had the train piled up, it could have killed a lot of people," Nelson pointed out.

He went on to say that Santa Fe never "closes the file on such a case."

Involved in the accident was the regular eastbound passenger train which is designated No. Two by Santa Fe.

may be removed so that wedding ceremonies may be performed within the circle, as well as other services. A small "gate" also allows passage for the pastor.

To the right of the altar is the Baptismal font. The entire sanctuary is carpeted in red and pews are padded in gold.

Exposed beams are featured in the Cathedral ceiling and the rear of the sanctuary is of paneling, including the balcony area.

Exterior of the new church is light-faced brick, matching that of the educational unit constructed in 1956. Entrance to the church faces west, over which is the tower topped with a spire and cross of copper.

New Sunday School classrooms extend to the east of the new sanctuary. From the large entry hall are hallways providing access to the east and north wings of classrooms, as well as the stairway to the balcony and entry to the new sanctuary.

Hallways are all covered with tile.

The construction marks the third church built in Bovina for the Methodist congregation.

Serving on the building committee are Bedford Caldwell, Mrs. Robert E. Wilson, Vernon Willard, L. M. Grissom, Jim Ware and Durward Bell.

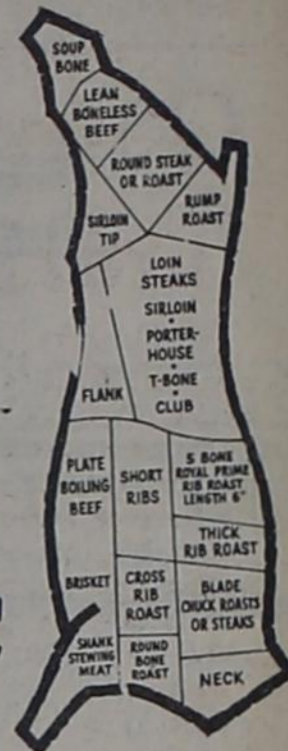

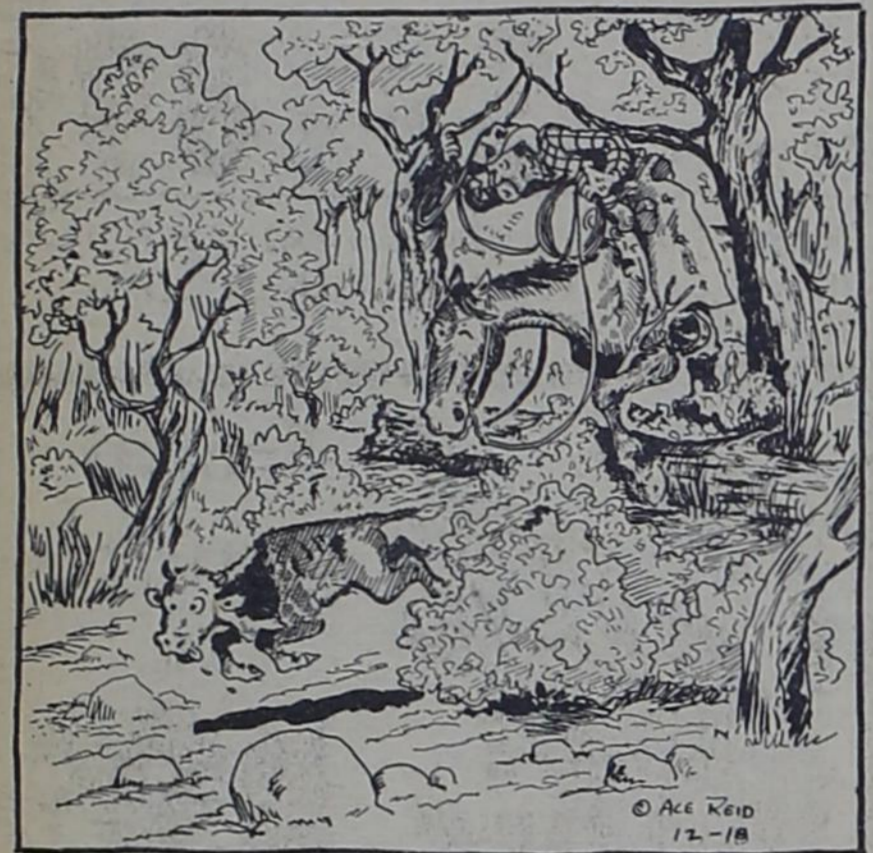

In City Limits--

Council Passes Traffic Rules

The Bovina City Commission met Thursday in regular session and passed two City ordinances concerning traffic regulations within the City limits.

One ordinance demands that the state low of the 30 miles per hour speed limit on city limit streets be observed within Bovina except where speed limit signs are posted.

This 30 mile per hour speed limit has been a state law in Texas for many years and the commission has given Bovina policemen instructions not only to enforce the law within city limits, but to issue traffic tickets to violators.

Another city ordinance prohibits "U" turns except at street intersections and parking within 10 feet of the end of the curb on a city street.

It is also illegal for drivers to cross the center line or cross opposite traffic lanes on any street inside City limits except at street intersections.

Other actions included the approval for purchase of two gasoline pumps for the city, the transferring of \$4,750 from the sinking fund to Security State Bank in Farwell to cover bonds and a \$25 raise in salary for both the trash collector and city secretary.

The City of Bovina approved a motion to cooperate with the Municipal League on the ordinance promoting legislation on a municipal sales tax on a permission basis.

Ordinance
 Be it ordained by the City Commission of the City of Bovina, Texas, Inc. that after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person operating a motor vehicle within the City limits of the City of Bovina to:

Make a U-turn in any street except at intersections. As used herein, the term "U"-turn shall mean a turn of at least 180 degrees.

Park a motor vehicle within 10 feet of any intersection. Any person so parking shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Parking a motor vehicle more than three feet from the curb. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined, not less than \$1.00 and not more than \$100.00. An emergency and extreme public necessity exists and this ordinance shall be effective after its first publication, and shall be published in the next issue of the "Bovina Blade", a weekly newspaper, published within the City of Bovina.

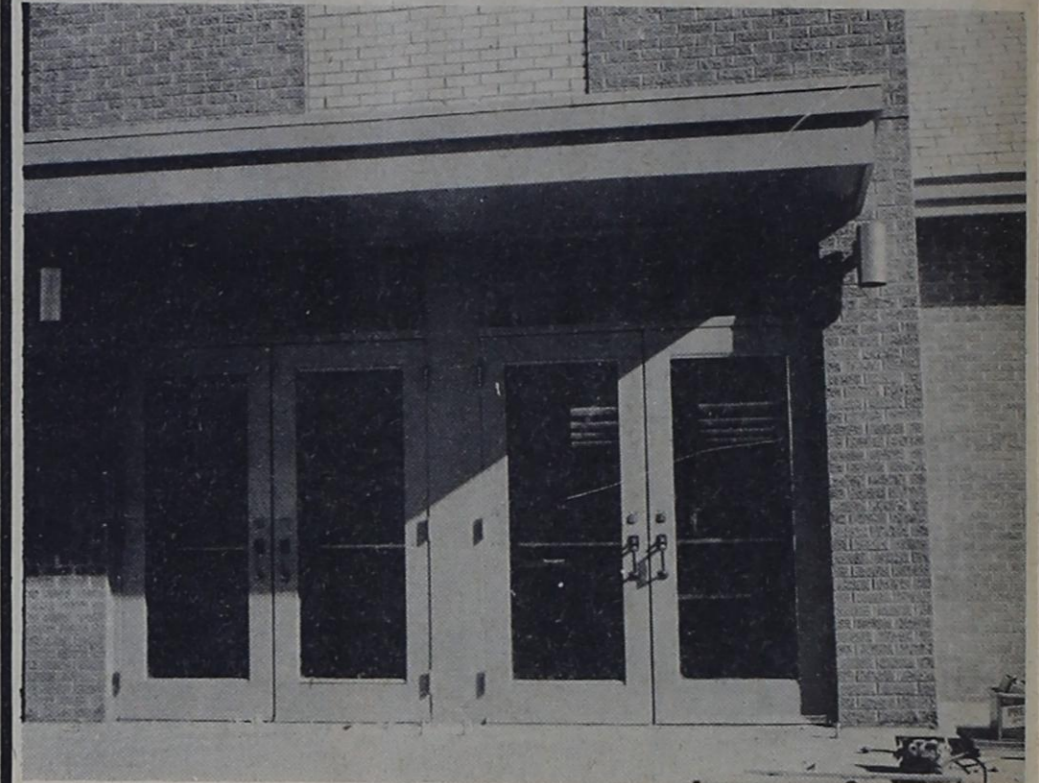

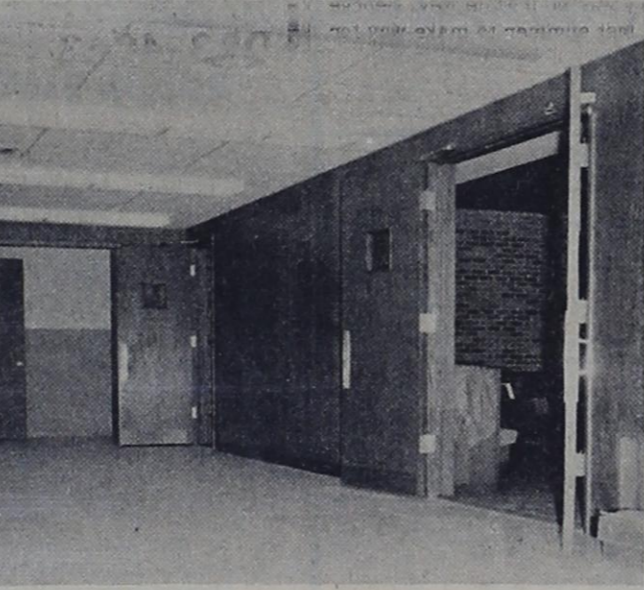

From 1905-1966 --

Church Represents 61 Years Of Faith

As the Bovina Methodist Church opens the doors to its new sanctuary this week, it not only looks back on many years of service to the community, but also forward to the people whose lives it will enrich in the future.

The third church building erected by the Bovina Methodists, the new building was three

years in the planning and six months under construction.

"It's very structure reflects the faith of its people," Rev. J. B. Fowler, Jr., pastor, said.

He continued that within the chancel are three points of emphasis which reflect the functions of the church in worship, the preaching and reading of the Word, the administration of the

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, and the Sacrament of Baptism.

"This is in keeping with the purpose of the church for the conduct of worship, due administration of God's Word and Sacraments, edification of believers and conversion of the world," said Rev. Fowler, who has been pastor here since 1965.

The Methodist Church was organized here in 1905. There were nine charter members which met in a one-room school building, which later became the Catholic Church. Rev. V. H. Trammell, a missionary preacher, was the pastor.

Probably the oldest members of the church now living in Bovina are Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hastings, who joined the church in 1917.

Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Williams joined the Methodist Church here in 1922. Other long-time members include Mrs. Pearl Hastings, Gene Ezell, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ross, Mrs. Aubrey Brock, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Jones, Mr. and Mrs. Wilbur Charles, Mr. and Mrs. I. W. Quickel, all of whom became members in the 1920's, O. W. Rhinehart, Mrs. John Wilson, Mrs. Earl Richards, and R. N. Williford, who have been members since the 1930's.

Although she has been a member since the 1940's, Mrs. Margaret Caldwell has served the Methodist Church since the 1920's. There are possibly others who have been long-time members as well.

The first church building was erected across the street from the present church in 1910. Here the members worshiped for 37 years. The first sanctuary was constructed during the ministry of Rev. J. A. Sweeney.

A financial drive for a new church building got underway in 1944 while Rev. Roscoe Trostle was pastor.

However, World War II was being fought, there was a scarcity of materials and construction of a new church was postponed.

Then in 1947 when Rev. George D. York served the Bovina Methodists, a new church was built across the street. The first service of worship was held on Oct. 5, 1947.

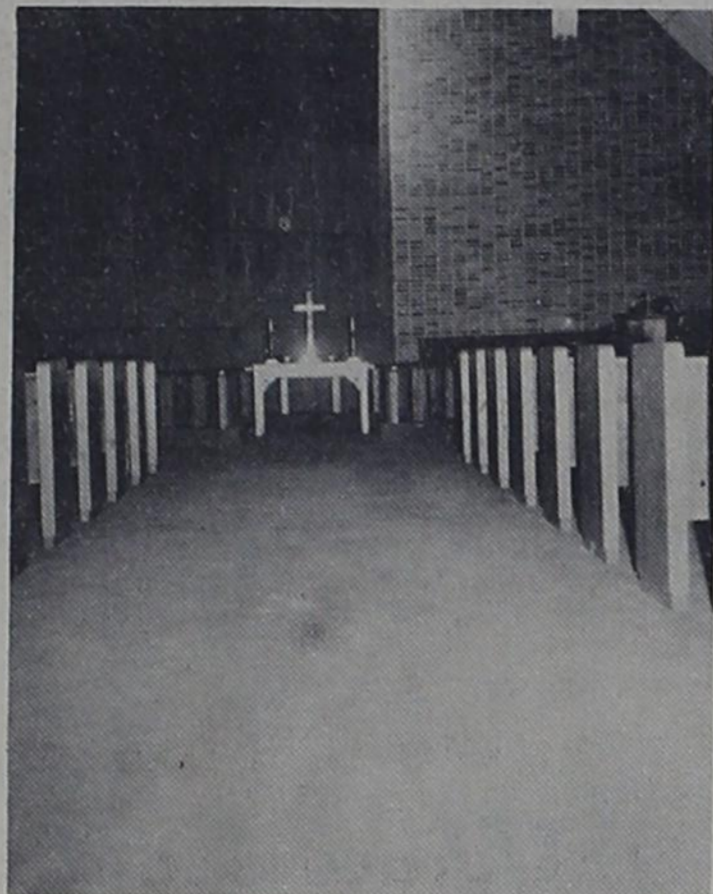
Further improvements were made in 1948 during the ministry of Rev. J. B. Baker when brick veneer was added to the new church.

In 1956 the education building was added to the north side of the church, during Rev. W. R. Beard's ministry, and this wing was retained when the old church was razed last summer.

The old bell that had hung in the church for many years, has been installed in the tower of the new edifice. It will be rung each week, Rev. Fowler said.

Pirtle, 1929-1930; Ansil Lynn, 1930-1934; I. E. Biggs, 1934-1938; J. Neland Hester, 1938-1941; M. R. Pike, 1941-1943; Roscoe Trostle, 1943-1946; George D. York, 1946-1948; J. B. Baker, 1948-1949; Oscar Bruce, 1949-1951; I. T. Huckabee, 1951-1953; Walter White, 1953-1955; W. R. Beard, 1955-1958; Davis Edens, 1959-1961; Harold Morris, 1961-1965; and J. B. Fowler, coming here in 1965.

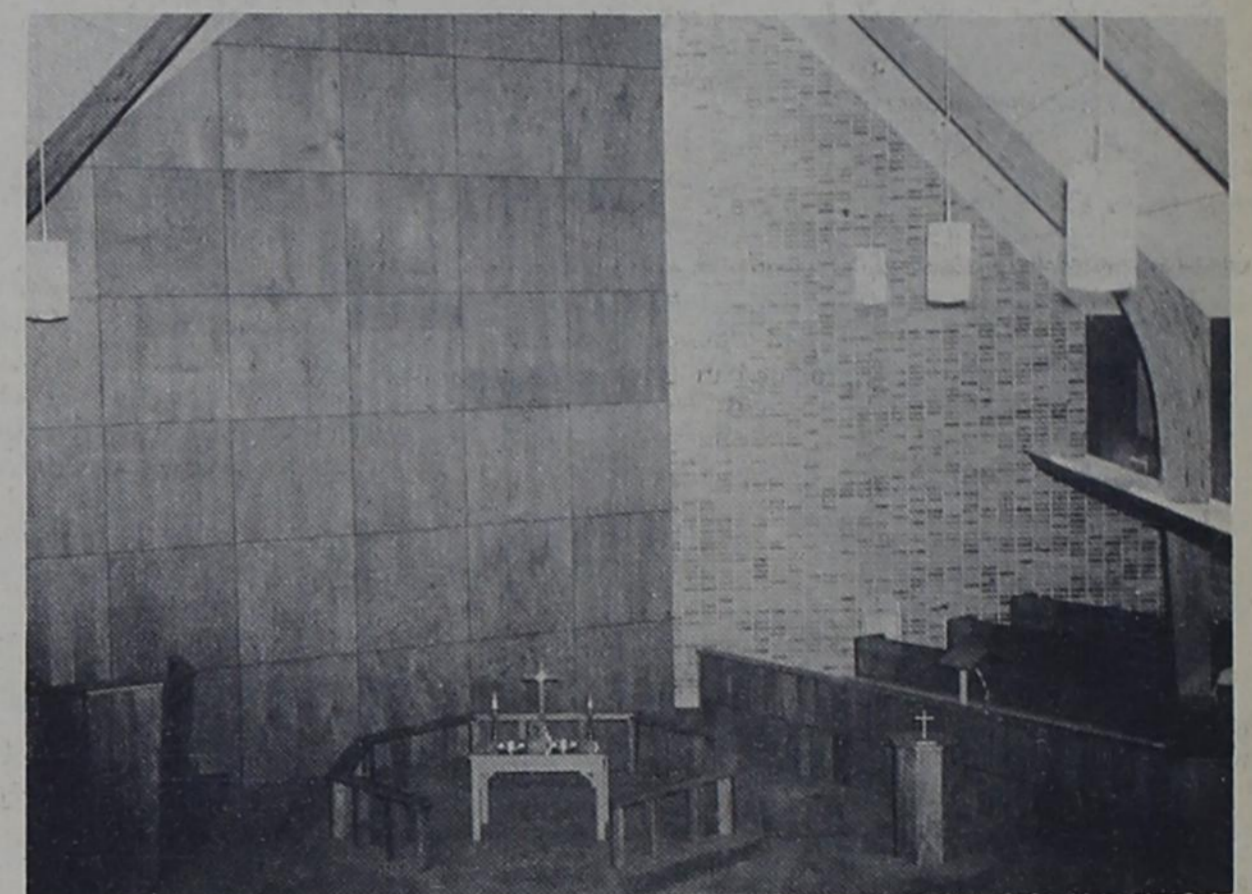

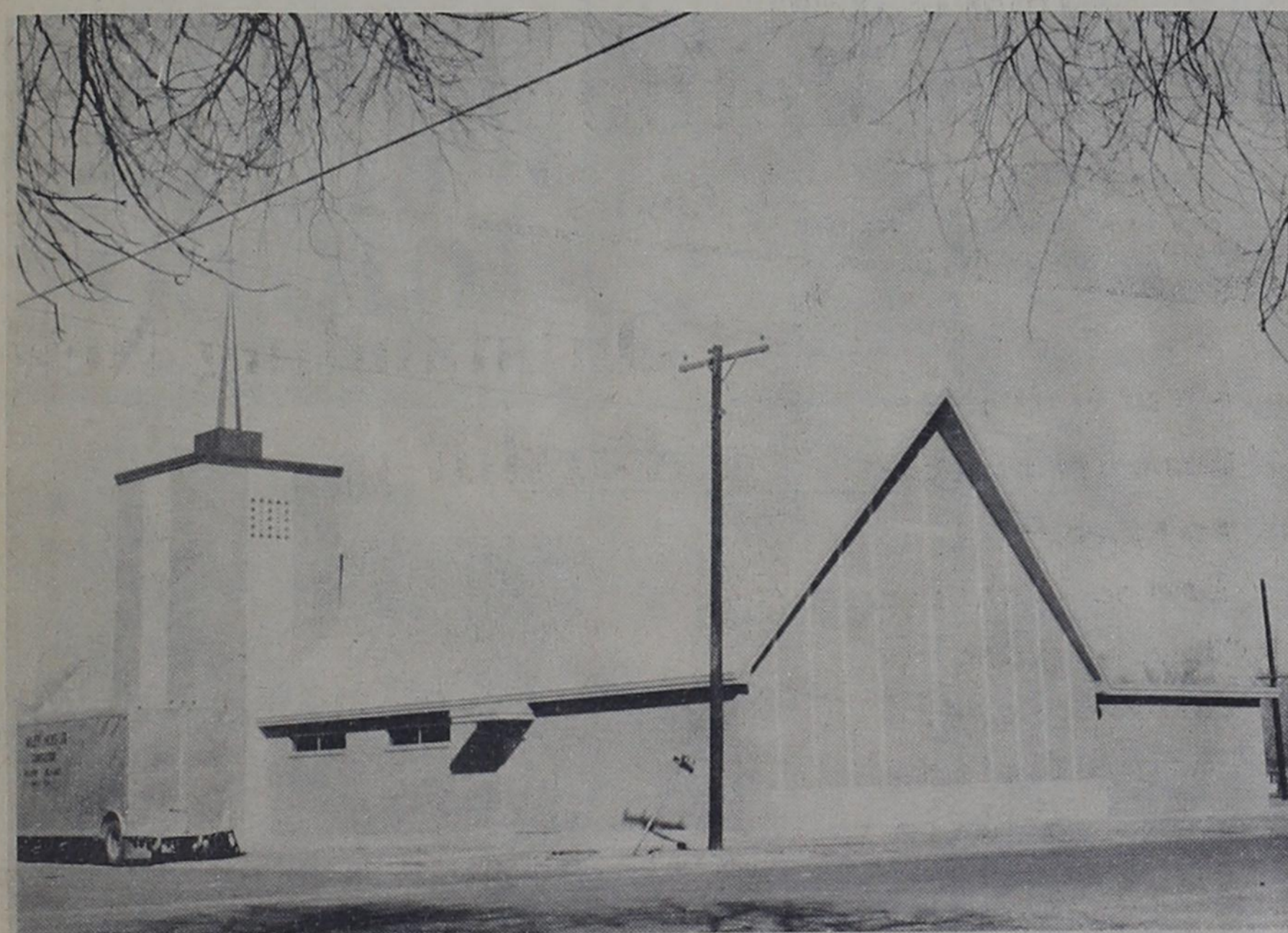

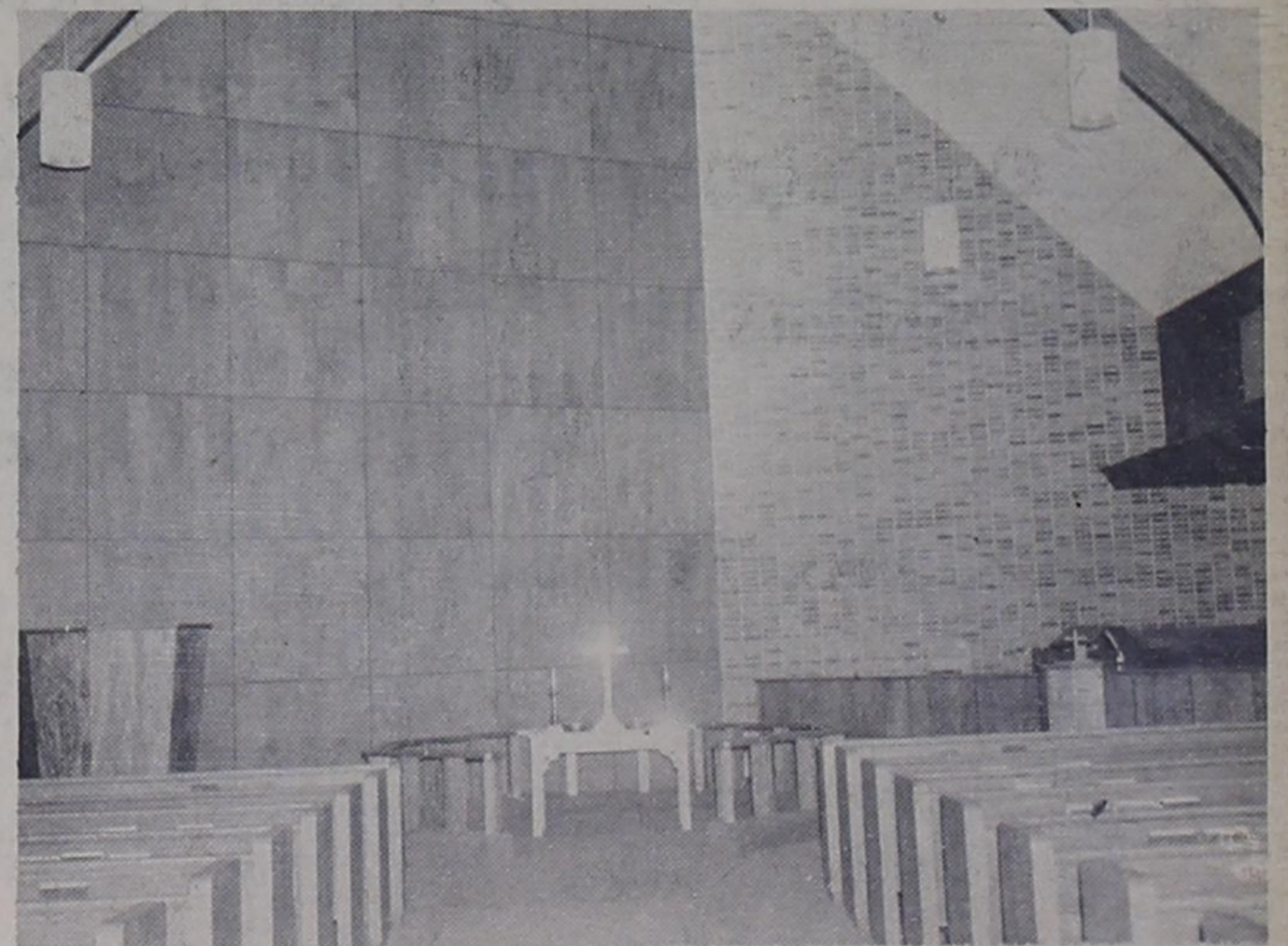

Friona led the "B" girls 16-3, 28-9, 40-16 before winning 44-22.

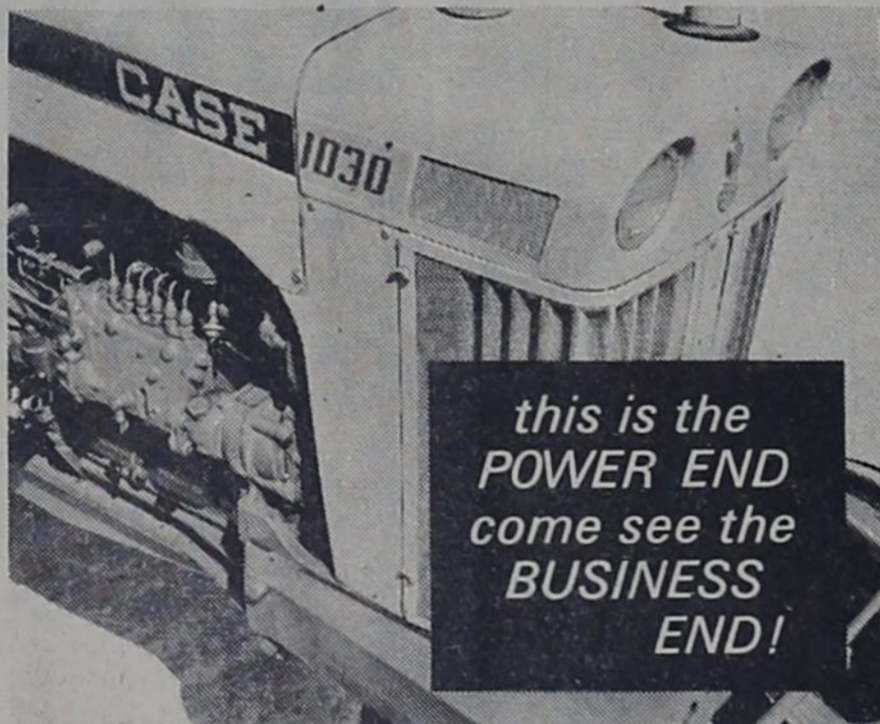

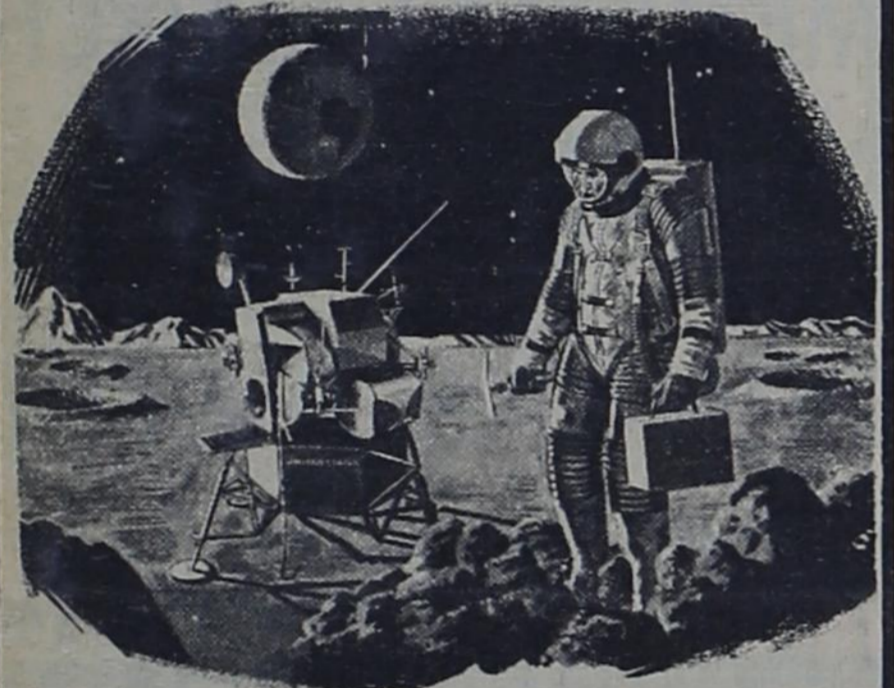
