| Mrs. Virgil (Reta) Patterson, who is exployed in the Depart ment of Religious Life at Mcin a fifteen day tour of Japan. <br> Whrn interviewed conce:ning the tour, Reta said, "There was so much to see and do, it would take hours to tell it all." So we esks 4 Reta to give as much as possible a "play by play" desetiption of Jepan, its people, its culture and the historic backgcount. Here's her repart: <br> Fifteen days in Japan studying with Dr. Spae in Tokyo, and w'h cther professors at Doeshia University in Kycto is a memorable experience. The trips into Nara and Osaka were both beautiful, entertaining and education- <br> Our McMury group was received by the Mayor of Nagoya. (Mayors in Japan have a great deal of prestige as well as power.) The news of our arrival in Nagoya and the reception by the Mayor was televised and all the Iowspapers carried artieles about cur group. We all felt like VIPs. experience a Kabuki play is an parts are played by men. The vice of the "girl" startled me with its masculinity before I realized that all parts were being played by males. Stories about the play were available to us in English and by reading the story before the play began we were able to follow the actions although we could not understand the larguage. <br> While we were in Osaka we atteaded the Barraku Puppe: form of puppetry in the wolld, dating back to the seventern'h century when three different art form - joruri (narration), pup- | pet cacration and samisen muform what is known today as Bunraku, Today the Bunraku troupe is managed by a semigovernment organ called the Bumraku Kyckai. <br> The Bunraku dolls are about halr life cire. Their eves move. their eyebrows rise, their mouths ofen and shut and their hands and arms gesture gracefully and realistically. As a rule, each doll is operated by three manipulator. who work in perfect unison. The manipulators carry the dolls onto the stage and are visibic throughout the play. We were entertained in the fessor and leader, Dr. Ted Yamamori. Very few tourists experience the joy of being a guest in private homes of $a^{\circ}$, land, the home of Japanese people was an indescribable joy. <br> 'Japan is a beautiful, c'ean land. The politenes and clealiness of the people will always remain in our memory. Many flowers were in bloom and the winter vegetables gave a lovely gree. fook to the country. The pine trees, the bambon and tea are all evergreen as well as many others we could rot idertify. How reassuring and yes, a bit surprising to leok into the southern sky at night and see a favorite constellation, Orion. He was in almost the same position in the sky at 9:00 o'clock, above Japan as he is at the same hour at night over Texas. <br> "Hawaii is everything you have heard that it is.
