and came first to the tomb; and stooping and lookand came first to the tomb; and stooping and look-
ing in, he seeth the linen cloths lying; yet entered he not in. Simon Peter therefore also cometh, fol lowing him, and entered in the tomb; and he beholdeth the linen cloths lying, and the napkin, that was upon his head, not lying with the linen cloths,
but rolled up in a place by itself." (John 20:4-7) The implications consequent upon these facts are wrappings. The large linen face cloth in which the head was wrapped was neatly folded and laid in seperate place. Who did it? Why, if not Jesus? Whoever it was was in no hurry. Nor were the
grave clothes disheveled, but they were "lying," William Barclay, professor of New Testament a Glasgow University, and renowned as a scholar of
New Testament Greek, isists that the Greek text New Testament Greek, insists that the Greek text
actually means that the clothes were "Iying in their actually means that the clothes were "lying in thei
folds." That is, they were in a cocoon type shell as
if if Jesus had simply passed through them without disturbance! Other facts add power to implica-

eyewitness account says "He that was dead cam forth, bound hand and foot with grave-clothes; and his face was bound about with a napkin;
Jesus saith unto them, Loose him and let him go." Jesus saith unto them, Loose him and let him go."
(John 11:44) Consider that Lazarus could no (John 11:44) Consider that Lazarus could not
loose himself being bound hand and foot with loose himself being bound hand and foot with
grave-clothes. Others had to let him go. The point is, Jesus was bound the same way. John testifies that Joseph of Arimathaea acquired the body
from Pilate. Then Nicodemus came to join him, "bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as the custom of the Jews is to bury." (John 19:39,40) Notice, he was prepared for burial "as the custom of the Jews is to bury." In other words, just like Lazarus was bound for burial.
