

Had he waited another day, the law could not have taken effect before January 13. Under the new law, daylight saving time will be in effect

all year for a two-year period and for the first time since World War II. Some estimate its impact could reduce electricity and heating demands up to 2 per cent, mainly in the north.

As a companion to the law, the President also signed an executive order setting up machinery for considering appeals from parts of the country, notably states falling into two time zones, to seek exception from the daylight saving time requirement.

### **Plans to Reduce Insecticide Use Said Successful In Tests**

COLLEGE STATION -- The to help cotton farmers depend fruiting phase. less on insecticides, has developed a system which has worked well in Southeast Texas trials.

Researchers believe that if the technique is expanded to the estimated 215,000 cotton acres in ths region, it would increase output by more than 13,000 bales, secticide treatment. reduce the amount of insecticides applied by about 1.4 million pounds, and boost producer net returns more than \$10 million.

Experiment Station entomologist Dr. Winfield Sterling said the study was conducted in cooperation with the Texas Department of Corrections (TDC).

cial notice, Texas Railroad Commission Chairman Jim Langdon, Agriculture Com-missioner John C. White, and Federal Petroleum Allocation Officer for Texas Murphy Hawkins called on the oil industry "to supply fuel without further hesitation to. . . priority users "

The notice referred to official orders published in the Federal Register on November 19 and remaining effective until January 16, 1974, providing for mandatory allocations to agriculture along with mass transit systems and oil and gas exploration.

The federal order removes the stipulations for form completion or other conditions for sale and delivery of available diesel fuel during the period stated.

"From all indications from petroleum industry reports, the necessary fuels are on hand, However, local distributors are reluctant to release supplies because they are under the impression that they still must comply with regulations to complete government forms," Commissioner White said.
