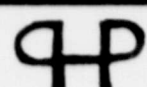

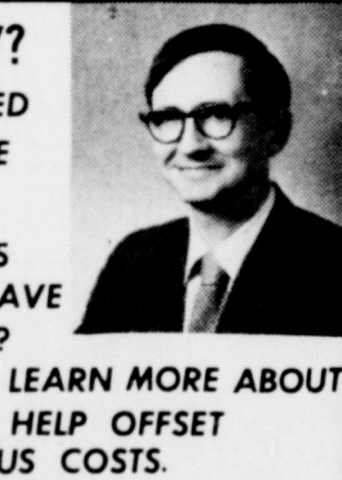

# POLICE REPORT

On August 17th, the Police Department received information that a subject was possibly in route to Merkel and information was that he was going to do bodily harm to his wife. The Merkel Police had answered a family disturbance call the previous night and was aware of whom the subject was. This individual was arrested in Merkel, and at the time of his arrest he had a knife strapped onto his belt and had a black jack (Police Blipper) on the seat of his vehicle. Subject was turned over to the Taylor County Sheriff's Department on a warrant they had on him. The Merkel Police filed on this subject for Unlawful Carrying of Weapons. He pleaded guilty in County Court at Law on August 23rd and was fined \$100.00 plus Court Costs. A subject arrested by Merkel Police on June 7 of this year was found guilty in County Court at Law for Possession of less than 2 ounces of marijuana. He was fined \$250.00 and received 180 days in the County Jail. The jail term was probated. On August 23rd, a subject came to one of the local business places and attempted to sell a number of cases of oil. The oil was not purchased

however, one of our local citizens was contacted in regards to this matter rather than the Police. This citizen then had to relay the information he had received to the Police. By that time the subject in question had left the Merkel Area. Even though the Police know whom the operator of the vehicle was, we needed to check this subject while he still had the merchandise. Law Enforcement is everyone's business, however, when something unusual or suspicious is observed, the first call should be made to the Police Department so they can take what action is necessary, such as calling other Police Agencies by radio etc.

On August 25th, The Merkel Police observed two subjects hot rodding in two separate vehicles. The Officers knew who one of the operators was and they pursued the second vehicle which drove in a reckless manner and speeds exceeding 90 miles per hour. When the Police returned to the vehicle, they observed the other vehicle involved and stopped the subject in order to issue a citation. Upon stopping this vehicle, it was learned that there were four occupants in the vehicle and two cases and ten cans of beer in the

vehicle. Two of the occupants were juveniles. The two adults were fined \$27.50 each in the Merkel City Court on August 26. The subject that attempted to elude the Police was fined a total of \$115.00. Various Merkel Citizens asked the Chief of Police to do something about the excessive drinking by minors and the Patrolmen have been ordered that should they have probable cause to stop a vehicle and observed an excessive amount of alcoholic beverages present and the individuals were minors, a complaint will be filed. If the person stopped is not a minor and it is found that there are minors present, then the person will be filed on for making alcoholic beverages available to a minor unless the person involved is the minor's parents or guardian. We will not stop every vehicle we think might have alcoholic beverage in it, however, should we have probable cause to stop the vehicle and it is found, then proper action will be taken.
