A&M Economist Tells Farmers To Gain Acceptance in World

"What can we do (as farmers)?" This was the challenge issued last Thursday night by Robert H. Kinsey, Texas A&M Extension Service economist, as he addressed members attending the annual Texas Farmers Union banquet, Taylor County, at the Merkel High School cafeteria.

Kinsey, well-known speaker on agriculture, listed four points as affirmative goals in

furthering the acceptance of the farmers in the world, particularly the United States, today. They were:

1. Look upon farming as a business. "It's important. Right today farm products are the only things they (the U.S. powers to be) have to exchange" (for oil, etc.);
2. Use productive techniques in farming responsibly. "Use fertilizer and chemicals wisely. Maintain a safe ecological balance and do it positively or we're all going to go hungry;"
3. Participate in civic action. "Develop positive program. Find a common ground with other organizations and groups;" and
4. Develop all the influence you can locally—both political and social influence begins at home."

Elections See Incumbents Win

Merkel voters were not in a mood for change Saturday as they returned all incumbents to office in both the city and school elections. Charles Jacobs and Bobby Toliver were returned as School Board Trustees and Darrell Farmer and Kent Satterwhite were returned to their city council posts. The only challenger for the city council was Henry Guenther.

The voters elected Jerry Gibson to fill the unexpired term of Danny Doan on the School Board. Doan took a job in another city several months ago. Others running for Doan's spot were Larry White and Wayman Wilkerson. Don Hart was elected to the board for a three-year term on the school board.

Kent Satterwhite led the voting in the city election with 105. Next was Mayor Allen with 102, Darrell Farmer, 92, and Henry Guenther with 35. Satterwhite is employed at Taylor Electric Cooperative, Inc. Farmer is manager of Taylor Telephone Co. In the race for three-year spots on the school board, Bobby Toliver led the voting with 186, while Charles Jacobs had 172 and Don Hart polled 169. Whisenunt had 14 votes. In the contest for the two-year spot, Jerry Gibson had 86 votes, Wayman Wilkerson 72, and Larry White 66. In the city election there were four persons receiving write-in votes. They were Connie Mack Seymore, John Lazona, Freddy Toombs and E. A. Conley.

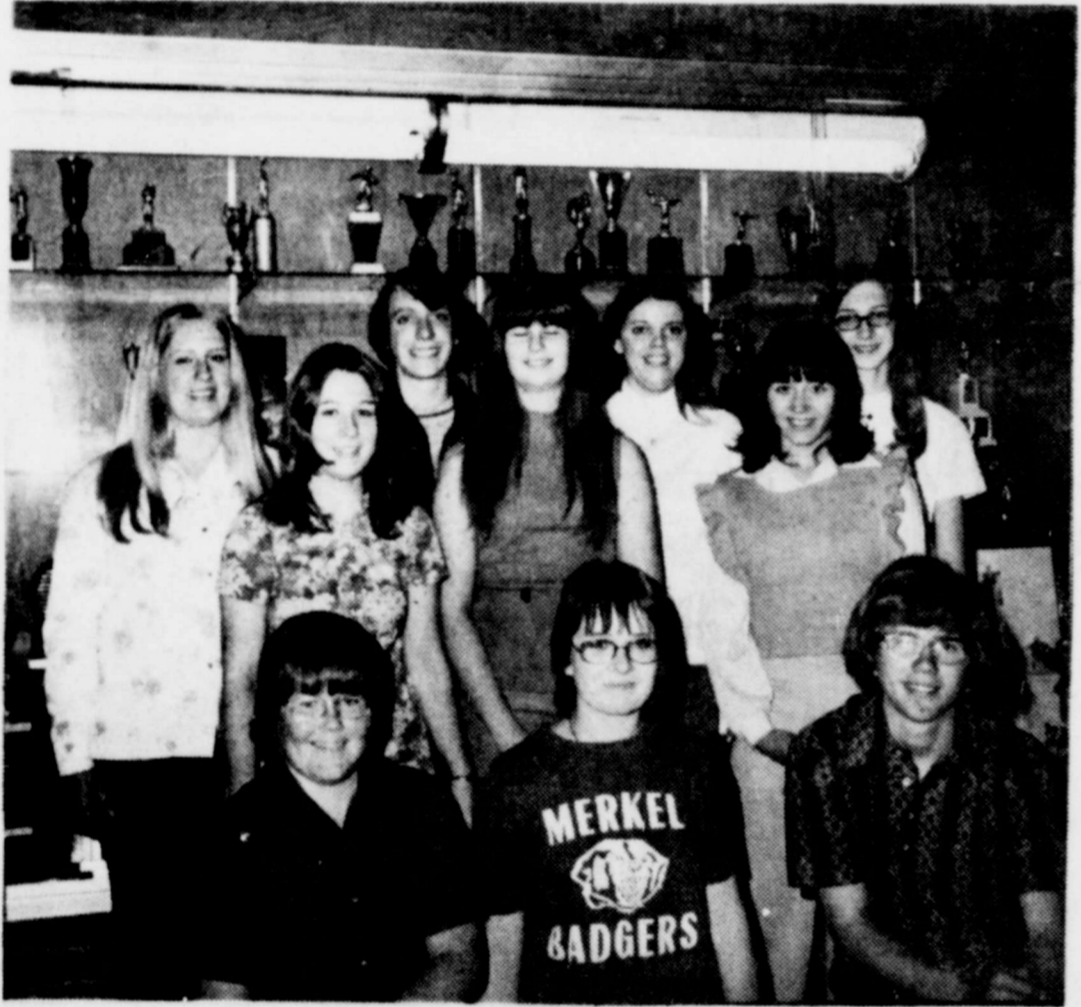

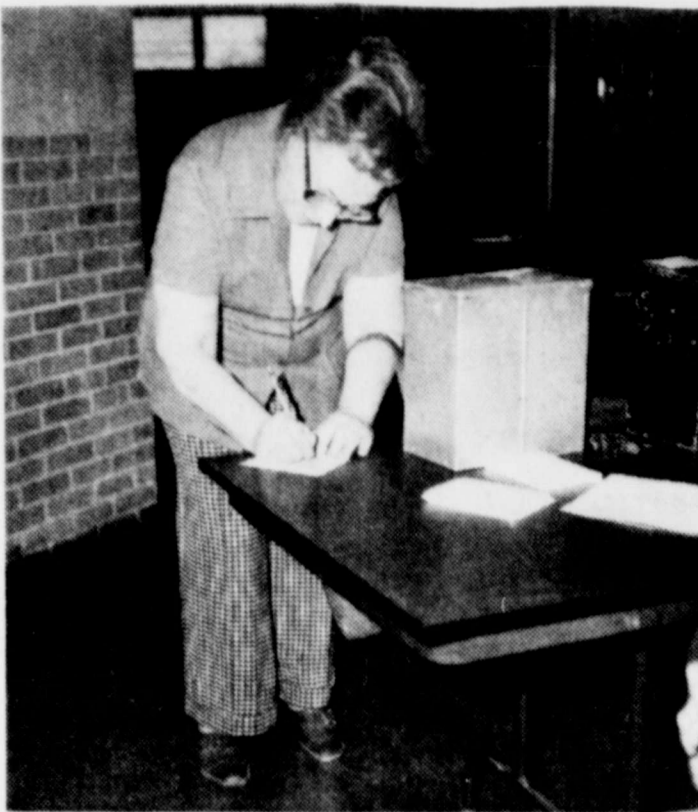

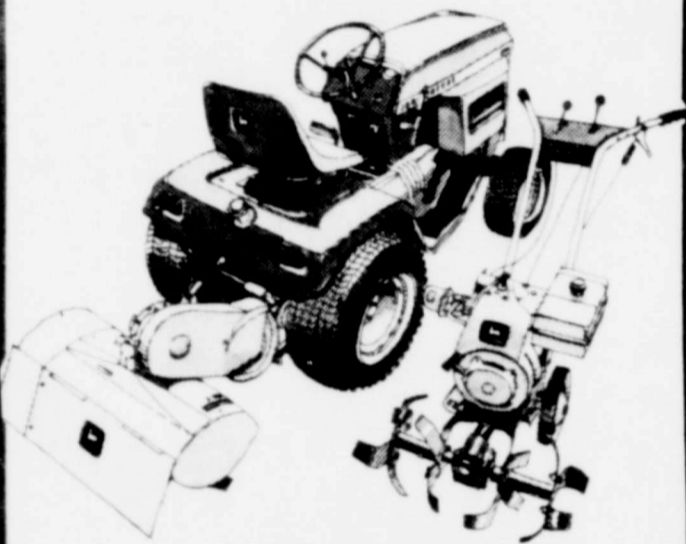

Mrs. Jim Atkinson Named BOL Chairman

Mrs. Jim Atkinson has been named chairman of the Bread of Life Campaign to fight children's lung diseases, according to Chuck Laurent, president of the Lone Star Chapter, Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.

Mrs. Atkinson of Merkel will lead local volunteers in raising funds to support research and care programs for children affected by lung-damaging diseases like cystic fibrosis, severe asthma,

chronic bronchitis, bronchiectasis, and a condition called "childhood emphysema."

Cystic Fibrosis, an incurable genetic disease, is inherited when both parents carry the recessive gene for C.F. It is believed that one in twenty persons or 10 million Americans may carry the C.F. gene, usually without knowing it. Current research funded by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is seeking a practical test to identify these carriers.

Because of improved therapy and constant research, many C.F. patients are living beyond infancy to their teens and into young adulthood. That same kind of therapy is relieving and often curing children suffering from other respiratory afflictions whose symptoms resemble those of C.F.

The Breath of Life Campaign supports not only research but over 100 C.F. Centers for diagnosis and treatment across the country, six of which are located within Texas.

Tax Rebates Will Not Have Effect On Food Stamps

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today issued a telegram to the states saying that the income tax rebates and special payments will have no effect on the eligibility of food stamp participants.

These rebates and payments were provided for in the Tax Reduction Act of 1975 which President Ford signed into law on March 29, 1975. The law provides refunds on 1974 individual income taxes and a special \$50 payment to recipients of social security, railroad retirement, and SSI benefits.

The Tax Reduction Act of 1975 requires that refunds and special payments shall not be counted as income or resources for purposes of determining eligibility or the amount of benefits received under any federal assistance program. Therefore, these refunds and special payments will not be included as income or resources under the Food Stamp Program.
