be found.







Vernon and Dottie came to Bovina when they were both very

Dottie moved with her family from Springtown, Texas, which is near Fort Worth. Her parents were Clarence and Missouri Magdelin Denney and the couple had seven children. Dottie's only living sister, Edna Nunn, lives in Missouri and her only living brother is Bernett Denney, who resides at Hawthorn, California.

Dottie went to school in Bovina and graduated from high school with four classmates. She said she is the only class member living and still has her diploma. The Wards' only daughter, Billie, also went to school and graduated from Bovina.

The Wards have three grandchildren, Kathy, Sharon, and Steve and all three live in Amarillo, as well as their daughter, Billie and her husband Ken Harrison. Kathy is the mother of the Wards' only great grandchild, Kiley, who is eleven years old.

Vernon was born in Florence, Texas and his parents were James and Talythia Ward. He had two brothers and two sisters who have all passed away. Vernon said he was the 'baby of the bunch',

His family moved from Florence to Lubbock, where they pulled cotton for a living and farmed. They moved to Bovina from Lubbock and farmed, helped run a thrasher and baled hay.

Vernon later worked for the State Highway Department, then worked as bus foreman at the

During the war they lived in Dalhart where he worked as an electrician at the Dalhart Air Base, for a year and a half. This was the only time they lived away from

Vernon owned and operated Ward's Welding Shop for thirty-three years before retiring. Vernon spoke of how Bovina

had changed because at one time there were forty or fifty businesses here which included a movie theater, two barber shops, beauty shops, three dry cleaners, and many, many more.

telephone office in Bovina on second street and Dottie was the only telephone operator. The Wards lived in the same building which included a long room for the telephone office, a kitchen and a small room where they slept.

Dottie was also the bookkeeper for the company, and kept the money there. She said people would come to make calls and she would call the main office in Hereford and they would put their calls through.

She told about one night that she was really frightened. She said someone knocked on the door at midnight and when she opened the door she recognized a man from Farwell, whom she thought to be in prison.

She said she was literally 'frozen from fear'. He wanted to make a collect call but did ask if Vernon was home. Dottie told him he was in the next room so he didn't cause trouble.

She worked there until the dial telephones were installed and said she made \$37 a month.

Dottie led the church choirs at the Methodist and Baptist Churches. They could not afford to hire preachers for both churches all the time, so they took turns and people would attend the Baptist Church one week and the Methodist Church the next week. Dottie sang in the choir for 49 years.





SENTENCE IS SCORED

Donna Hall Found Guilty Of Assault

Donna Hall was found guilty of assault in 287th District Court last Friday, after being charged with pouring acid on her ex-husband, Kevin Hall, as he lay on the bed in the couple's home in the Hub

Community last February 13. Mrs. Hall was assessed a \$10,000 fine and ordered to make restitution of \$300,000 in hospital bills incurred by Kevin Hall.

District Attorney Johnny Actkinson said he was not pleased with the sentence.

"I think that she should have been given the maximum sentence, because this is a serious offense," Actkinson said. "There is no justification for it."

It took the nine-woman, threeman jury about four hours to deliver the guilty verdict, and another five hours to decide on the sentence.

Mrs. Hall was facing a maximum of 10 years in prison and

continually asked Hall why she believed she was in such danger, bringing up other witnesses who planning to separate amicably.

Meanwhile, Holder called witnesses to support Donna's claim that she was emotionally and physically abused during much of their 11-year marriage.

"It was not a happy marriage. He treated Rick (Perkins) like trash. He would tell Rick he was worthless and no good," said Chris Gibbins, Donna Hall's 19-year-old daughter.

It was pointed out that Rick Perkins, Donna Hall's son, had committed suicide about four months prior to the acid incident. The son left a suicide note, according to testimony, in which he said "Mother, please don't look for me. Have Kevin do it. Forgive everybody. It's nobody's fault."

On Wednesday's opening day of testimony, Kevin Hall testified that he had heard his wife say she was going to kill him prior to being doused with the acid.

"I told her I didn't come home to argue, and I wasn't going to argue. Then she left the room," Hall said

during the first day of testimony. "What did she say when she left the room?" Actkinson asked.

"I'm going to kill that lyin' son-of-a-bitch," was Hall's reply.

The acid incident happened on a Friday night. Hall called 911, and then jumped into the shower to wash off the sulfuric acid. It has been speculated by those knowing how this acid works that adding water to the acid mades it even

The Halls reportedly kept the jug of acid for use in their septic tank at their rural home.

New Dressing Recipe Can Add To Your Holiday Meal

By CARLA McKEOWN
With the holiday season fast approaching, there's lots of cooking to do, new recipes to try out and old favorites to make again.

Although there's much good to be said for traditions, sometimes the same meal after holiday meal seems a little boring. Although there's not much we can do to change the turkey, we can add the spice of variety by making a different dressing or stuffing.

If your family tends to balk at any alterations to the traditional Christmas meal, go ahead and make

Christmas meal, go ahead and make your regular stuffing, but offer them a choice with a new dish. Try the following recipes with your meal this Christmas:

Traditional Cornbread Dressing

- 2 cups cornmeal 2 teaspoons baking powder 1 teaspoon baking soda 1 teaspoon salt

- 2 eggs, beaten 2 cups buttermilk 2 tablespoons hot bacon drippings
- 3 celery ribs, chopped 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine 12 slices day old bread, crumbled 2 to 2-1/2 cups turkey or chicken
- 1 cup milk
- 2 eggs, beater
- 1 teaspoon poultry seasoning 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black

pepper Combine the cornmeal, baking powder, baking soda and 1 teaspoon salt in a large mixing bowl. Add 2 beaten eggs, buttermilk and bacon drippings, and mix well. Pour the mixture into a well-greased 10-inch cast iron skillet or 9-inch round pan and bake at 450 degrees for 35 minutes or until lightly browned. minutes or until lightly browned. Let cool, and them crumble into a large bowl. Saute the celery and onion in the butter until tender. Combine the cornbread, celery, onion with the bread, broth, milk, 2 eggs, salt, poultry seasoning and pepper. Mix well. Pour the mixture into a lightly greased 13"x9" baking pan. Bake at 450

degrees for 25 to 30 minutes.

Note: for a Southwestern flavor, substitute the following Spicy Sage Cornbread for the cornbread made in the Traditional Combread Dressing above.

Spicy Sage Cornbread
6 slices bacon
1-1/4 curs corn meal

- 1-1/4 cups corn meal 3/4 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon salt 3 teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon crushed dried red
- pepper 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black
- pepper 1 teaspoon paprika 1-1/2 cups buttermilk



In a 9- or 10-inch cast iron
skillet, fry the bacon until crisp.
Crumble the bacon; set aside the skillet with the bacon fat. In a medium bowl, mix the corn meal,

flour, salt, baking powder, red papper, black pepper and paprika. Stir to mix well. In a small bowl, mix buttermilk, egg and honey.

Add the buttermilk mixture to the cornmeal mixture. Add the sage, onion and bacon. Re-heat the bacon fat in the skillet. Pour the hot bacon fat into the corn meal mixture and stir well. Pour the corn meal mixture into the hot skillet. Bake at 425 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes. Use in any basic combread dressing recipe.







County Community Hospital the night of the incident and then airlifted to Lubbock.

A key witness on Thursday was Suzanne Foley of Lubbock, a counselor for battered women, who testified that in her opinion Donna Hall had been abused. Ms. Foley testified "Why do battered women ever defend themselves?....self-defense."

Actkinson pointed out in his cross-examination that Ms. Foley only interviewed Donna Hall after the assault charges had been brought against her.

During fierce and rapid questioning by both Actkinson and Holder about whether Donna Hall's actions were "reasonable and prudent," state District Judge Jack Young stopped the banter, ordered the jury out and called the attorneys into his office for several minutes.

Also testifying on Thursday was Mona Sharrock, Kevin's aunt, who pointed out that immediately following the acid incident, Chris Gibbins had told her that she was asleep during the confrontation, as opposed to the daughter's testimony earlier that afternoon.


The trial gained widespread interest, from most of the regional news sources, including Lubbock and Amarillo newspapers, and Amarillo TV stations, as well as the Associated Press.

District Clerk Marjorie Watkins said her telephone had been extremely busy during the course of the trial, and especially on Friday when the case went to the jury.

"The case has been reported in the Dallas media, and I also have heard from the Associated Press," Mrs. Watkins said.

Speculation has been that the case drew so much interest because it bears striking similarities to Virginia's Bobbitt case, in which Bottitt was dismembered by his wife Lorena, who charged him with marital rape.

The Bobbitt case is scheduled to go to trial in January, 1994.
