cliche's like the plague.



Three Die In Icy Road Crash

Three Bovina men died early Friday when the automobile in which they were riding hit a patch of ice and skidded in front of an oncoming 18-wheeler.

Mike Bermea, 21, Lorenzo Rocha, 22, and Raymon Rocha, 27, were pronounced dead at the scene by Parmer County Justice of the Peace Louise Hancock.

The accident occurred about a mile east of Farwell on U.S. 60 about 3:30 a.m., Parmer County Sheriff Rex Williams

The three men were eastbound on U.S. 60 in a two-door Toyota, Williams said. The truck was headed west.

Sheriff's deputies could not determine the speed of either vehicle because of icy conditions, Williams said.

Department of Public Safety troopers responded to about a half-dozen wrecks due to road conditions Thursday night and Friday morning, according to a DPS spokesman.

Also in Parmer County, an unloaded Friona school bus flipped onto its side about 7 a.m. Friday when the driver turned on the access road off FM 214 near Friona. No one

Driver Mary Stone was just starting out on her route and had no passengers. On the south side of the overpass, the bus slid onto its side as she was attempting the wide turn. She sustained minor injuries.







Comptroller Applauds St. Treasurer

State Comptroller John Sharp has congratulated State Treasurer Martha Whitehead for contracting with the Comptroller's Office to collect, audit and enforce the state tobacco tax.

"Critics of this plan are just blowing smoke," Sharp said. "We have consulted with the Attorney General regarding this interagency contract. It's a very routine procedure for state agencies to contract with one another to provide services, and in this instance, it's the cheapest way to get the job done."

"By poviding tobacco tax collection and enforcement services for the State Treasury, we can cut the number of workers required to perform those duties in half and save Texas taxpayers more than a half million dollars during this biennium."

Sharp says his office will be able to collect the tobacco tax more efficiently than the Treasury, making the most of a revenue source which has declined steadily as tobacco sales have declined.

"I don't mind if we collect less tax because people are kicking the tobacco habit. But if anybody has a habit of not paying taxes on tobacco products, I'll cure them of it," Sharp said.

He was a farmer/rancher in the Friona area, was a past member of the Friona American Legion Post 206, was named "Man of the Year" by the Friona Chamber of Commerce in 1962, was an Army veteran of World War II, a member of Calvary Baptist Church and Friona Lions Club.

His survivors include a daughter, Kathy Lester, and son-inlaw, Wade Lester of Del Norte, Colorado; two brothers, Horace Jones of Los Angeles, California and Albert Jones of Vernon, Texas; three sisters, Jessie Crownover of Santa Rosa, California, Daisy Billings of Lubbock, Texas and Margie Petty of Vallicent, Oklahoma.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Ollie Jones, in 1950 and Ed Jones in 1923, and a brother, Bob, in 1978.

FmHA Farm Borrowers Restructure Debts

"Farmers with loans from the U. S. Department of Agriculture's (FmHA) may be able to put floodeasements in exchange for a habitat. reduction in their debt," George Ellis, FmHA State Director, said

Use of the easements is not limited to flood areas, but it may be particularly helpful in such areas.

"Eligible lands may include wetlands, marginal farmland, highly erodible land, woodland, wildlife area, and several other," Ellis said. "In certain areas, there may be as an Equal Opportunity Lender, instances where farmland was damaged so severely by the recent flooding that restoring it may cost

more than its agricultural value." "In those cases, a conservation easement may be a solution. Under this program, a voluntary easement can be placed on a portion of the land in return for a reduction in the

amount owed to FmHA."

Ellis said the easements are for Farmers Home Administration 50 years or more and can help rebuild soil conditions as well as damaged land under conservation encourage development of wildlife

"Not only can FmHA farm borrowers take marginal acreage out of production in this way, they also can materially reduce their farm operating costs," Ellis said.

Farmers who think they may be eligible should contact their local FmHA County Office for further information.

Exams are done by appointment only. For information or to schedule an appointment, call 1-800-377-HOPE (4673) or (806) 359-4673.

The total cost of the screening is \$70.00. This includes the X-ray, physical breast exam and the radiology fee for reading the mammogram. Funding has been provided by the Texas Department of Health to allow for free breast screenings for women who qualify.

The major goal of the clinic is the early detection of breast cancer. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self-examination and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer.

Breast screening guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society are: (1) Learn and perform breast self-examination every month; (2) Have a physical examination every year; (3) Have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age: age 40, one baseline mammogram; 40-49, a mammogram every 1-2 years; 50 and over, yearly mammograms.




