He was born September 2 County, Texas. Sides moved with his family to Young County in 1906, and a year later
Burkburnett in Wichita County. He came to Parmer County in
December of 1925, and married Janie Palm December 21, 1926 . The couple farmed in the Oklahoma Lane Community
