We have some windows in our church

with glass that is a kind of milk white but is sort of crinkled and patterned. This window is like all other windows while it is light, but when it is dark there may not be another window in the world like it. This is not a large window and it is about one fourth way up the stairway leading to the balcony. I passed the window one night about two years ago and it was fairly dark in the church. When I looked out the window and saw the big star I was startled, and amazed, and truthfully I was a little frightened.

You can not see through this window in the daylight, but there it was nowa STAR that filled all the outside. It is not in the window-it simply fills all the outside view from that window. It is a colored star and gives the impression that it is a spiritual thing, and not the creation of man, I stood looking at the sight, bewildered, and confused. And then I thought-This is the Glory of God. The blinking of the eyes did not make it go away. Cautiously I started looking for an explanation. I went away and returned but it was still there. To make a long story-shorter-I looked for the explanation and this is what I found.

A parking lot light across the block at the far side of the Baptist Church grounds was reflecting through our church window. I do not know why a parking lot light makes a beautiful colored star as it shines through our window. All I know is-it is there and you can see it--that is if you look at the star through the window of the Methodist Church. No one else has a star like this one.

There is something strange about all this. The Baptists can not see the star unless they look through the Methodist window. But, on the other hand, the Methodist would not have a window with a star if the Baptist light was not shinning into it. Wouldn't it be a terrible thing if the Methodist refused to let the Baptist look at the star through the Methodist window-and then the Baptist would cover up the light that shines to make the star- and then the Methodist wouldn't have a window with a star in it.

Tell It Like It Is

"Tell it like it is" has become almost a prover in this modern society. Education, religion, and business, even politics, try to impress people with the need to adopt this basic idea--to make any message worth telling short enough to be remembered and long enough to include all important truths, broad enough to include everyone and challenging enough to restrict anyone; and directly to the point

directly to the point.

Such a message is the message of Christmas. Not the tinsel, lights, trees and presents to thrill the kids. Not the family reunions and home cooking that satisfies adults. And certainly not the emotional plays, nostalgic songs, and religious myths and traditions that at best only hint at the truth; but the stark reality of the Angelic proclamation

of the birth of Jesus.

"And the angel said unto them, fear not; for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; ye shall find a babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger." (Luke 2:10-12)

manger," (Luke 2:10-12)
The introduction, verse 10, prepared the hearers for the message. A message which was designed for their personal good and very deep well-being; for joy is much deeper than mere happiness. A universal message which would grow from a hillside arena to encompass the whole earth in coming centuries.

The heart of the message, verse 11, identified the person born to be the fulfillment of prophecy. Earlier proclaimed and promised, the message of the Savior's birth bore the unmistakable signature of God's accomplishment in prophetic fulfillment, His name, Jesus, means Savior, so the angel's words could not be forgotten. The mere calling of His name was a reminder. "Unto you is born a Savior. . ." from the very first, even as a babe, His earthly min istry was of the fore. The angel did not say the one born "will be" a savior, but that the "Savior is born." "Christ. . .," the one special promise of God of the Messiah at long last realized. And, wonder of wonders. He is "Christ the Lord. . ." The exclusive title applied only to Jehovah in the Old Testament, applied to Jesus, uniting through incarnation God and man in one person to accomplish total fulfillment of God's redemptive plan.

As Savior, Jesus was born to the cross of calvary bringing redemption from sin through His sacrificial death.

As Christ, Jesus was born to the tomb, to carry to total defeat the power and bondage of sin and death. The sinbearer of all those who open their

hearts to Him.

As Lord, Jesus was born to resurrection, alive forevermore, establish-

ing His kingdom as eternal. First in the hearts and lives of His people and Christmas a real Easter

Earth.

Verse 12, then, concludes the message with both a direct and implied commission to the shepherds. Direct in the immediate location of the birth place so that they might meet Him personally. Implied in that they should share what they had both heard and seen so that those at every age who would personally submit to the King of Kings would partake of His eternal life and

eventually, totally over Heaven and

Yes, "Tell it like it is" the tinsel, lights, trees, santas, presents, parties, and gaity are as much of a part of real

Christmas as an egg-laying rabbit is of a real Easter!

To you who decry the absence of Christ in Christmas, make sure that He, Jesus, is truly at the heart of your own personal Christmas. To you who know the Lord Jesus Christ and are repulsed by the extreme commercialism and emotionalism of the Christmas season, please reflect. This is the best they have or ever will have unless you share the real message of Christmas with them. Don't just tell them what is wrong! Tell them what or better, who, is right! Tell it Like It Is... and soon... and often. Have a real, joyful Christmas.
