It is such a pleasure to see Weldon McAninch driving around town these days. Weldon, I think now is the time for you and Margaret to take that fishing trip you've been talking about for several years!

I received a pamphlet this past week from the Tarrant County Humane Society, Inc., in Fort Worth titled "Greyhound racing is nasty bloody business from start to finish!" I had no idea the horrible things that go along with dog racing. Here are some of the facts: ---- A picture in the pamphlet shows a starving Greyhound in a cage with a bowl of water and a white rabbit. This dog has been caged with the rabbit and gone unfed for four days. If he does not kill the rabbit, he will be eliminated as a racer and shot. On the coursing field, a jackrabbit is released into an enclosed field moments before a pack of hungry greyhounds is set free. As the dogs close in, the rabbit bleats in terror as it zigs and zags to escape. Often a rabbit goes berserk with fear, and kills itself running wildly into the fence. Then it's done, with the dogs tearing the live rabbit among them and snarling over the speils. In early training, the rabbit's front leg is sometimes broken to give the dogs a better chance. From the coursing field for training, the greyhounds begin track racing. Here the rabbit hangs by its hind legs, tied dangling inches off the ground-and moved by a mechanical device around the track to tease the dogs into hot pursuit. At the finish line, the lure slows and the dogs are allowed to catch the rabbit. Often the rabbit is retrieved, and the dying animal is tied on again to bait a fresh string of dogs. Perhaps one out of a hundred rabbits escapes. A conservative estimate is that more than 85,000 rabbits are savagely torn apart a year. Other animals used as lures are kittens, chickens and piglets. Piglets are considered especially good because they squeal a lot. this barbaric sport not only subjects the helpless lure animals to unbelievable terror and savage death but also cruelly exploits a splendid dog for money and frequently destroys it when a dog can no longer earn its keep. It is almost impossible to rehabilitate as a pet an animal trained to chase and kill moving objects. Once the dogs have learned to kill rabbits, they attack and kill any small moving animal, and if another greyhound suffers a bleeding wound, they will attack and destroy it as well. "Animals cannot be made to fight each other," says Texas Law, but rabbits don't fight Greyhounds. They run for their lives. That's the loophole that allows Greyhound breeders in Texas to supply thousands of dogs trained to race to kill. And for numerous tracks through the state to offer gory "Fun" for crowds of men, women and children. It is a nasty business---as cruel and exploitive to the dogs as to the rabbits torn to bits. PLEASE take the time to fill out the coupon at the bottom of the Classified Section to amend the law in Texas on animal cruelty. It will only cost 13 cents for the postage stamp!




