Board Approves 'No New Taxes' **School Budget** been cut from the budget

The Merkel School Board has approved the 1977-78 budget for Merkel Schools. The budget is up \$117,000, a 9.2 per cent increase. This is a smaller increase than last year's budget. Total budget for the coming year is \$1,751,795.00.

School Superintendent Travis Davis told the board members that the budget is the result of much belt-tightening by the district. He went on to explain that the budget at its present level has cut maintenance funds extremely low. In addition the possible addition of one teacher and two instructional aides have also

Highlights of the meeting included addresses by Texas' new Commissioner of Agriculture, Reagan Brown, and State Compt roller Bob Bullock, "one of the most colorful and controversial men in Texas politics today.'

Others were Lieutenant Governor Bill Hobby, Dr. Gail Dunning, a counseling psychologist f r o m Greenwood, Nebraska, and Owen Hallberg, president of the American Institute of Cooperation, as well as several Texas
