According to Dr. Robert Schoonover, Coordinator of the Special Education Department at H-SU, "The program is geared toward activities that the parent can do in the home to help the exceptional child and activities that the teacher can do in the classroom to do the same. This program will lean toward the practical aspects of helping the exceptional child, not just the theoritical.'

Schoonover also stressed that the conference is open to all people who have dealings with the exceptional child and to people who want to know more about the exceptional child.

In addition to Dr. Hudson, four other specialists in the area of special education will be on hand to hold mini sessions on l Friday.

Barbara Reese, Director of Miliam Children's Training Center in Lubbock, will speak on "Functional Living Skills for the Severely and Profoundly Retarded"; Dr. Hudson will bring a session on "Programming for the Exceptional Child in the Resource Room and Regular Classroom"; and Dr. Schoonover will speak on "How Parents Can Help the Exceptional Child in the Home'
