MEDICAL CONFERENCE HAILSACUPUNCTURE Anaheim, Cal.- Bronchial asthma headaches, tooth pain, athletic injuries, and the assorted ailments of
sick horses have been successful targets of the acupuncturist's needles, according to a series of Chinese Total Health and Fitness here. The findings were presented admidst a growing consensus that there may be a sound, biologic basis for the efficacy David Bresler, director of the Pain Control Unit of the University of California at Los Angeles, presented the results of his study of the effects of acupuncture six traditional Chinese acupuncture points on the back, hands and legs of 12 patients suffering from bronchial asthma induced by a drug, relief was relief, Dr. Bresler noted, persisted for several hours. declared Dr. Glassberg. As additional evidence several of the acupuncturists at this meeting pointed to work recently carried out at the University of
