"We had a one-China policy when we thougin there was stï a possibiilt the counterrevolution that would throw you Commies out.
"Now we've got a two-China policy. To hand over Taiwan, which
violated practically none violated practically none of the ideals expressnment that has violated practically all of them, is for the birds, until and unless Taiwan so chooses.
"We know you got yourselves into a mess with the Thoughts of Mao and
the Great Cultural Revolution. We'd like to help you. But if the price o your friendship is our acquiescence to imposing your types of controls on 1 million presently free people, forge
