Badgers looking for win no.

There is good news and bad news for the
Merkel Badgers drive for a winning season this
year. The good news is that three of their four remaining ga mes will be played in Badger
Stadium this year. The Badgers have won their
two previous home games and suffered four losses on the road The bad news is that Badgers will face last four games.
Ballinger is 1.5 on the year and Badger head Balinger is $1-5$ on the year and Badger head
Coach Jerry McLeod says he doesn't see how Ballinger is at $1-5$. He says Ballinger is tough and
they have some outside speed that just may cause nightmares for Badger defenders. Sr. running back Ellison Portis has 9.6 speed
