## Hearing postponed in suit

That hearing Land has been postponed at the request of Abilene Altorns. The suit was filed against the Merkel ISD, it's superintendent and all superintendent and all board members. The suit asks that the board cease and desist and asks that all actions taken by the board since the time of consolidation be declared null and void. Abilene attorney Mike Baskerville is representing the Merkel ISD. Baskerville told the Merkel Mail the Merkel ISD. Baskerville told the Merkel Mail late Tuesday that the hearing would be postponed late Tuesday that the hearing would be postponed and that he had no idea when it would be escheduled. The Mail obtained copies of the pre-trial motions and the defendant's original answer to the suits asks that the suit de dropped because the piaintiffs (Tye PTO) lacked standing to bring or maintain the suit, that the suit contained "allegations that are wholly inadmissable and irreleevant heresay" and that the plaintiffs had "incorrectly quoted sub-paragraph C of Section 19.238 of Texas Education Code in a substantial and material manner."
