Legislature. The principal opponent of that measure was the Shell oil Company, which is based in the Netherlands, Antilles, a country with which the U.S.
has a special treaty in which it citizens or has a special treaty in which it' citizens or
corporations pay no capital gains, estate, gift, inheritance, dividend or interest taxes. "The Farmers Union wants to stop huge
investment firms, foreign or domestic, from investment firms, foreign or domestic, from
speculating in finite land resources, concluded Butler. "American farmers are interested in producing food and fiber, and it's downrigh impossible for them to compete with high-rolling
investors who are interested only in land speculation.
