## Price To Introduce

 Legislative PiecesSenator Bob Price has today
announced that he ispre-introducing
a resolution that could bring
"initiative and referendum" to
Texas.
The resolution will be filed this
week with the Secretary of the
Senate for placement on the
Legislative calendar.
The resolution proposes to amend
Article III and XVII of the Texas
Constitution so as to reserve in the
peopple the powers of initiative and
referendum.
Senator Price explained, "This
amendment gives the people the
power to participate in the
penactment of legisation. Initiative
will allow the people of Texas to
propose laws and constitutional
amendments and to adopt them at
the polls independently of the
Legislature. Referendum would
allow the people to reserve to
themselves the power to approve or
reject at the polls any act or part of
an act passed by the Legislature."
"I can think of no better goal.,"
said Price, "than to give the people
of Texas the right to participate in
this democratic form of govern-
ment."."
