# Merkel, area blanketed with snow

Al hough the National Weather Service in Abilene does not have an official measurement of the weekend snow here, eleven inches of snow fell Saturday and Sunday

No fatalities have been reported because of hazardous road conditions, although many motorists were stranded because of wrecks or impassable roads.

At one point Sunday, I-20's West bound lane was closed for three hours to clear wreckage from an 18 wheel truck that crashed into the guard rail of an overpass at the Nolan-Taylor county line. Cars were stacked up for two and one half miles while wreckage was cleared. The driver was not injured seriously.

A group of Methodist became stranded about 15 miles south of Merkel while attempting to attend a meeting at Camp Butman Sunday afternoon. Area farmers offered the stranded motorists food, warm drinks and tow-outs from FM 89. The county also sent a piece of heavy machinery to help pull out the stuck cars.

City officials reported no major problems connected to the snow, although many large trees were seriously damaged from the weight of the collecting snow.

The weather conditions also forced the closing of Merkel and Trent schools. FM 126 ten miles south of Merkel, as well as FM 89 were also closed because of slick roads.

The National Weather Service did say the weekend snow sets all time records for Nov. 16 and 17. The largest amount before this weekend was in 1937.

The weekend snow was a blessing for local grain farmers as most winter grains are already in the ground. The melting snow will provide more than enough moisture to start healthy stands.

The snow wasn't such a welcome sight for cotton farmers who still have crops on the ground. The snow will damage the consistency of the mature cotton, will weight down the plants and break stalks, making harvesting much less efficient and difficult.

Local phone and utility service was not interrupted during the snow and forecasters are saying it will be well above freezing during the day the rest of the week.

How does 11 inches of snow sound to you for Nov. 22-23?

If you are a cotton farmer, you probably did not like it too much because of soggy cotton and fields, but, if you are a grain farmer, you probably could not have had the snow delivered at a better time.

For the rest of us, the snow caused MISD School cancellations Monday and a lot of beautiful scenery.

No fatal traffic accidents were reported near here Sunday or Monday, although Merkel Police and Fire Department teams were kept busy pulling stranded motorists from their cars and hauling out vehicles stuck in the snow.

Fifteen Methodist Church members headed for a retreat at Camp Butman were stranded on FM 89 Sunday and were rescued by farmers and county vehicles. The Robert Malone's, South of Merkel, had 15 unexpected people for dinner Sunday evening while Robert spent most of the day in his pickup hauling stuck cars out of snow

Old timers spent Monday trying to recall the last, large snowfall in the area and consensus says it was January, 15, 1954 when the area received it's last large dose of snow. That three

day total was 14.7 inches with drifts of 21/2 feet. Mrs. Carl Edwards of Trent, called in Monday morning and said she's found a real oddity in her back yard Monday morning. She said she had gone into the back yard to remove a snow stretched power line from a mesquite tree and found green mesquite beans on her tree, and she had never seen green mesquite beans this late in the year on her trees in 47 years at the same house in Trent.

The weekend snow did transform the area into a New England type postcard scene reminiscint of Currier and Ives derrotypes of yesteryear and staff photographer, Drew Mawson, captured

some of the icy scenes found elsewhere in this week's Mail.

Trent and Highland met in a battle of the six man unbeatens in Trent Friday night and Trent saw their perfect record spoiled as Highland won 30-28. It was the third loss in three years for the Trent Varsity football team and the loss will keep Trent from advancing to the playoffs.

Trent finished the season with 8-1 record, not bad, for a team that was picked to finish fifth in a seven team district. They finished second.

# Council will meet Monday night

Badgers find close is not good

enough in 14-7 loss to Albany

The Merkel City Council will meet Monday night to consider an ordinance that will place fees for landfill use on non-Merkel residents.

The fees, as listed in the Mail last week, have been proposed for adoption by the council, and council will either vote to adopt those fees, or make changes.

Costs for hiring one full time gate attendant and one full time grader operator, plus diesel fuel for the grader has been estimated at \$27,500 per year by the city.

It is not known how much revenue the fees will bring into the city. Persons intending to use the landfill, that do not reside within the city limits will be assessed a fee, depending on the size vehicle used to haul waste, and the content of the

Persons will pay the fees with coupons, which will be available at the landfill and at City Hall. Under the proposed ordinance, the city will not accept liquid waste at the landfill, will not allow anyone to pilfer or scavenge, and will open the landfill Tuesday through Saturday. It will be

closed on Sunday and Monday. Council has also indicated it wants the Merkel Police Department to file charges on persons who attempt to use the landfill after hours or when closed, and also wants prosecution of anyone who dumps outside of the restricted dumping area. The state recommends a fine of \$203.50 for

improper disposal of waste or garbage.

Council will also conduct a public hearing to hear proposals for use of federal funds to upgrade living standards in low income areas here Monday night.





## Tax rebates 5 % less this month

Merkel's one per cent tax rebate from the state five per cent sales tax is still running two per cent behind the same reporting period last year according to a news release from the State Comptroller's office.

Merkel received their largest rebate check of the year this month, \$8,854.51, compared to \$7,882.24 for the same period last year. Totals to date for 1980 are \$41,700.03 compared to \$42,974.05 for the same period last year, or a two per cent

Although Tye received a smaller check this month compared to last year's figures. Tye is still maintaining a seven per cent increase in rebates this year.

Tye received a check for \$3,260.51, compared to \$4,426.73 through the same period last year. Total checks for the year are now \$40,028.43, compared to \$37,319.52 last year or a seven per cent

Trent received a check for \$463.12 this reporting three month period. Trent's rebates are four per cent less than they were one year ago. Trent has received \$2,264.27 this year, compared to \$2,381.34 through the same reporting period

Texas cities shared \$80.1 million in rebates in October as total payments for the year went over a half billion dollars. That is an increase of almost \$60 million.

The city sales tax is collected along with the state sales tax by merchants and businesses and rebated monthly be the comptroller's office to the cities where the tax is collected.





# Stenholm elected

Congressman Charles W. Stenholm, re-elected without opposition to the 17th Congressional seat, said Wednesday that the national Democratic leadership "has to awaken to the need for redirecting our priorities to fit the needs of a changing country," in light of Tuesday's election

Stenholm, a Stamford Democrat who will be serving his second term in Congress, said the sweep on conservative victories across the country "underlines what I have been saying through my voting record for the past two years. The American people want to see this country returned to a sound fiscally responsible economic policy, returned to a strong defensive posture, returned to the dreams and promises held out to them in our Constitution and returned to the Free Enterprise System.

Commenting on the Texas Congressional races, Stenholm said, "of course in a couple of races, we will have to wait until the dust settles, but at this point the delegation seems to be holding its own. At the same time, the closeness of many of those

races cannot be ignored."

Stenholm, taking a "wait and see" but positive attitude about working with the Reagan Administration, said on general issues such as defense and the economy "we are not that far apart philosophically. Where we may differ is in how to best answer those needs, but the seriousness of the problems putting forth a united effort. Any partisan interests must be left behind with yesterday's newspapers."
Stenholm applauded the record voter turnout

nationwide, saying "no one can cry about voter apathy. The system worked the way the system was designed to work. Now it's time for those of us elected to do our part."
