The Merkel City Council, last night, learned Taylor Electric would ask for a rate increase in February and also discussed ways

council at the Feb. 9 meeting. Taylor Electric is seeking $\$ 677,718$ in additional revenues, or about a 12.6 per cent increase. In the volumes of material presented for study by council, Taylor 22.03 cents per killowatt hour (KWH) New, requested minumum rates for farm and 180 KWH would be 0.03370 per KWH for the next 180 KWH , and 0.02170 per KWH over 200 KWH per month. Those rates would be in effect April through October.
