TSA says buckle up

Enjoy safe and happy drining this summer by buckling up seat belts, urges the Texas Safety Association (TSA)

"Make i Click-Buckle UP" is a national campaign in which volunieers across the country will be asking people to sign pledges promising to buckle their safety belts and put their children in child safe y seals.

According to National Safety Council statistics, every year and estimated 1.8 million motor vehicle occupanis are injured and more than 35,000 are killed in motor vehicle crashes. In Texas, 4,701 persons were killed in 1981 and more than 200,000 injured in motor vehicle crashes, according to Department of Public Safety Siaisics.

Ward says a pledge to buckle-up is the first step toward commitment. "We hope once people become comfortable wearing seat belts during heir pledge period, they will make it a lifetime habit. Increased seat belt usage will save lives according to National Safety Council statistics.

Tha program is funded through the West Central Texas Council of Governments through he Texas Depar ment of the Aging. The program is open to all people over 60 years of age and the disabled or handicapped. The only in-home deliveries of meals that will be made are to the disabled or handicapped.Council also was presented a listing of past due water-sewer sanitation accounts and decided to get tough on collections. Council passed a policy and voted to notify the public that any account over 60 days pasi due, that arrengements have not been made o pay the account off, will have their service disconnec ed.

.. Editor's Note: The following historical instalment deals with the period of July 3, 1914 up to Dec. 31, 1914.

.Merkel's first train car load of wheat was shipped out at a price of $67 \frac{1}{2}$ cents per bushel. The wheat belonged to W. H. Swafford and J. A. Woodard, both of Merkel.

A former Confederate Captain, William Hawkins was buried here. He was the youngest brother of the governor of Tennessee. He had moved to Merkel in 1908.

... The F & M Bank here announced it would construct a new facility here and that it had assets totaling \$325,000.

... THe Merkel Telpephone Company announced it had recently completed 7 miles of line construction and had added 23 farmers South of town to their subscriber list.

.Jum Toombs was elected public weigher and T. R. Lassiter won the county commissioner's seat from the Merkel area.

.. The Merkel City Coincil declared it a misdemeanor for any car or motorcycle not to be equiped with a bell or sounding device and a lamp on their vehicle. W. A. Cozart, an early day settler and father of

a man that invented a maize thrashing machine was buried here. He had moved to the Merkel area in 1890

Merkel schools announced their total enrollment of 359 students.

...Miss Dorthy Collins of Merkel narrowly escaped death, the Mail reported, when a runaway horse team crashed near West Hardware. The incident was wittnessed by about 15 people.

Merkel cotton farmers had tunred in nearly 13,000 bales of cotton at the end of the year.

.The Texas and Pacific Railroad decided to expand operations for their Merkel station after the company repported a 26 per cent increase in passenger tickets and a 13 per cent increase in freight rates.

.Throughout the year, the Mail reported on the German-Russian fighting that led to America's entry into World War 1.
