Academy of Sciences says in a report that diets rich in truits, vegetables and wholegrain cereals seem to reduce the chances of getting certain
kinds of cancer. The panel specifically urged kinds of cancer. The panel specifically urged
daily consumption of produce high in vitamin $C$ and carotene, which the body changes to vitamin
an innibit the noted that vitamin C in foods cabstances. It said foods rich in vitamin-causing
such
as citrus truits, tomatoes and as citrus truits, tomatoes and peppers, appear to
lower the risk of stomach and esophagus cancer. Foods high in carotene are associated with a reduced risk of many cancers, including lung, breast, bladder and skin. These foods include
dark-grean leaty vegetables and deep-yellow dark-green leaty vegetables and deep-yellow
truits and vegetables, such as carrots, spinach and broccoli.
The study also cited vegetables in the cabbage or their natural cancer-inhibiting substances. But ty/ committee advised against taking large

early planning. Expected target prices are $\$ 4.30$
per bu for wheat, $\$ 80$ per cer t. or grain sorghum, 76 cents a lo. for cotton cwt . $\$ 1 . \mathrm{g}_{\text {grain }}$ arghum, 76 cents a lb. for cotton
and $\$ 1.40$ per cwt. for rice. Regular CCC loan rates will be close to $\$ 3.65$ per pu. for wheat, $\$ 2.65$ per bu. for corn, $\$ 4.50$ per cwt . for grain sorghum,
55 cents per ID . for cotton and $\$ 8.55$ per cwt. for rice. Anticipated farmer-held reserve lan rates are $\$ 4$ per bu, for wheat, $\$ 2.90$ per bu, for corn, and $\$ 4.91$ per cwt. for grain sorghum. There is no reserve loan for cotton and rice
deficiency payments (difference between target price and CCC loan rate) that farmers could
expect are 65 cents per bu. for wheat, 21 cents per expect are 60 cents
but for corn, 41 cents per cwt. for grain sorghum, 21 cents a 10 . for cotton and $\$ 2.85$ per cwt. for rice. "Since reduced production will be a major goal
of next year's farm program, it will likely call for laying out 15 to 25 percent of the base acreage for each eligible corp." said Anderson. "Farmers should take this into consideration as they begin
land preparation and fertilizer and herbicide applications for next year's crops.
1983 farm income could improve some with increased participation in the farm program
since reduced production would help the supply since reduced production would help the supply
situation and allow loan rates to be more effective in setting price floors. On the demand side, lower interest rates should give a boost to the
marketplace. And an improved economic climate marketplace. And an improved economic climate
could spur the demand for farm products, said the economist.
Meanwhile, farmers will be looking at
controlling or minimizing operating expenses, controlling or minimizing operating expenses,
evaluating alternative crops for highest returns while taking a little price risk as possible, look at full participation in the government farm program, Anderson said.
