Cotton producers are on the
brink of reaping a pig payoff from the dollars they have invested qualityickly and in terms of noer through cotton incorporated in any cotton on earth and produce ieties. The breakthrough came with the recent acquisition of Rodgers Rodgers Cottonseed already has Cottonseed Company in Waco by the trade name of Cot-N-Nuts for Yazaki USA Corporation marketing of glandless worldwide kernals as a food source, Yazaki has some 40,000 acres contracted in Texas and Oklahoma this year varieties. As an incentive growers, the firm will pay a
premium for the glandless seed of $\$ 75$ a ton over the price paid at the
time by the oil mills for cottonseed up to a cap of $\$ 225$ per ton for the up to a cap of $\$ 22 s$ per ton for the
total price. The glandiess seed will be processed at the Rodgers Waco The contracted acreage ranges southern Oklahoma. Most of it is in the Texas High Plains. While a relatively few number of growers
will be planting the glandless warieties this year, many more producers will be reaping benefits from the research work.
Scientists have long known that major food source for humans and animals. Conventional cottonseed
which is seperated from the fiber in the ginning process, contains an acidic compound called gossypol
which is toxic to humans and most animals. However, researchers 30 years ago found a way to producing glands, hence galndless Over the past decade, several research firms have been used by
Cotton Incorporated to test the potentials of using the seed as a source of nutrition. Yazaki spokesman Kent Hood said the glandless varieties being planted now
perform equally or better than the glanded varieties conventionally
used in other areas. "They can
