Police chief says he will file suit

Merkel Police Chief Ray Pack told The Mail Monday morning that he would file suit against two Merkelites for defammation of character after two hearings were held in the Taylor County Court at Law last Tuesday. The two hearings concerned estates that are managed by Pack.

The Court ruled Pack had not mismanaged the estate of L. D.or Mrs. Rose Barnes.

The two hearings, one to rule on a motion to place an immediate temporary restraining order against any further transactions in the L. D. Barnes and the Mrs.

Rose Barnes estates, and the other, concerning whether or not Pack should continue to manage both estates, were both ruled in fdavor of Pack by Judge Sarringer. Rex Martin of Merkel had brought both suits. He was represented by Abilene attorney Lee Cox.

In the hearing, Judge Sarringer refused to issue a temporary restraining order and ruled in favor of Pack to remain administrator. Pack told The Mail Monday "After four hours of hearings, no evidence was presented at any time by any witness that any money had been embezzled or was missing from either

He also said, his attorney, Dub Burke of Abilene, planned to file suit against two Merkel citizens alledging deffamation of character and that his suit would ask for a public apology as well as attorney's fees.

Pack told The Mail "I have been stopped on the street many times in the last week and asked if I have been to jail or was in trouble for stealing thousands of dollars. These are viscious rumors and I am filing suit to clear my name, my family's name and to recover attorney's fees.'



Seat belt law has state support

Organization of the Texas Coali- results of the survey coincide with tion for Seat Belts and results of a national polls on the issue and new poll showing strong public confirm an earlier independent support for a seat belt law were survey, the Texas Poll, which announced today by Senator Ted Lyon (D-Rockwall) and Rep. Bill Messer (D-Belton).

Lyon and Messer are sponsors of SB 500 and HB 941, requiring front equipped with seat belts", the seat occupants of automobiles to use their safety belts.

"We are convinced that there is nothing this Legislature could do more effectively to save lives and prevent injuries on our streets and highways than to require seat belt usage," they said in a joint statement.

The Texas Coalition for Seat Belts, composed of 26 leading medical, safety, labor, legal and business organizations, gave its support to their legislation.

A statewide public opinion survey conducted Feb. 11-15, 1985, by Shipley & Associates, Inc., of Austin showed that 69 percent of the residents of Texas favor safety period before full enforcement belt laws for driver and front seat passengers. Experience in Canada, Australia and Western Europe shows that usage goes up to 80 percent or more when the belts are required."

They pointed out that more than 4,000 Texans die in traffic accidents each year, and that at least 1,000 of these lives would be saved






