



Your original debt of \$800 will have grown by \$145.27 due to the 1.5 percent interest charged on the debt balance each month. That adds up to 18 percent interest per year, she adds.

The specialist points out that some credit card companies charge more than 18 percent interest per year and that you would also be paying interest on the other unpaid charges in addition to those levied against the \$800 debt.

"There are two ways to reduce your credit card debt load," says Granovsky, "You can charge less than you pay off each month, which will reduce you debt over time. Or you can simply stop using credit cards and make payments until the debt is eliminated."

The agreement was reached by the association's board of director's and Vah, and then voted on by the membership.










