An example is where a taxing unit has territory in two counties, but only one of the appraisal districts appraises all the property in the taxing unit. Applications for exemption and

special valuation must be in the appraisal office before May 1.

Complete information on tax exemptions and rendition requirements is in a pamphlet produced by SPTB, "Taxpayers' Rights, Remedies, Responsibilities." The pamphlet also tells how taxpayers can challenge the values placed on their property by protesting to the appraisal review board. The pamphlet is available free from appraisal district offices or from SPTB in Austin.

'Burr' Hendricks

Ernest Herman "Burr" Hendricks, 75, died Friday at his home. Services were at 4 p.m. Saturday at Calvary Baptist Church with the Rev. Joe Davis officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill Cemetery, directed by Starbuck Funeral Home.

He was born in Stith, a small community between Merkel and Anson. He was a retired carpenter. He was a member of Calvary Baptist Church and the Masonic Lodge.

Sie Hamm

Sie Hamm, a former Merkel resident, died in Colorado City March 21, 1986.

Born Feb. 14, 1899, here, he was the eldest of seven children of early day Taylor County settlers, Frank and Elizabeth (Pearl) Hamm.

He married Blanche Durham, Jan. 27, 1924. He owned and operated Hamm's Drug Store here for many years and was a longtime owner operator at the Colorado Drug Store. In 1968 he moved to Fort Worth and continued in the drug business with his son. He retired in 1979 at age 80. He was president of the Colorado City Kiwanis Club in 1959 and had served two terms on Colorado City's City Council. He was also chairman of the Mitchell County Draft Board during World War II. He was a member of the Davis Memorial Methodist Church in Fort Worth.






