ORDINANCE # 86- 2.

KEEPING.

"AN ORDINANCE RE-GULATING NON RE-GISTERED VEHICLES ON CITY PROPERTY AND PROVIDING

PENALTY; Any person violating the provision of Section 1 of this ordiance shall be deemed quilty of a Class C. misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be subject to a fine of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200). Each transaction in violation of any of the provisions hereof shall be deemed a separate offense.


