



Ten years ago this week my Dad left

He was comatose at the end, so there were no last words. There probably wouldn't have been anyway. It just wasn't the way our relationship worked.

I'd been to see him in the hospital a week earlier after he'd battled his way through a near fatal night. We watched football, and occasionally each other.

I'd look at him and see a body tom apart by the spread of disease. A 59-yearold man who looked maybe 79.

When he looked toward me, I'd turn my head to the game on televison. After a while I'd catch him staring at me and he'd turn his own head toward the game.

He'd been a clean-living, clean talking Methodist preacher most of his life. He didn't smoke. He didn't drink. Yet his lungs were filled with cancer - as was the rest of his body.

Like all sons of such victims, I wondered, where is the justice?

I remember praying the night I returned to the hospital. Ever since I was three he had taught me this was the answer to life's problems. I just hadn't paid much

Thinking back, I probably didn't do it right. I started out shaming God for senselessly killing off one of his best lieutenants. Then I begged Him to get it over with - which He did.

God and I didn't speak for a while after that.

When you're raised in the kind of environment I was, though, agnosticism is difficult. Atheism is impossible. In a game of mental gymnastics it always came down to what was more illogical believing in a super-natural supreme being who lets good people get cancer, or not believing in one and assuming a lot of ridiculous coincidences?

I saw a car at a stoplight last week and it had a bumper sticker that read, "God, Guns and Guts - the American Way."

"Who does he think God is - Rambo?" I wondered. "Does he think God is a terrorist with machine-gun bullets strapped across his chest? An American who hates His other human creations?"

I wanted to stop his car and diagnose his sickness, but I knew he'd have to shoot me. Guts, you know.

My Dad, the preacher, would have handled the situation differently. Given a chance to talk to the guy, he would have gently removed the chip from the man's shoulder over a period of time. That's one of the things I liked about him. He kept his ego out of his religion.

He'd be 69 now and if he were here I have an idea of what he'd be doing. On Sunday morning he'd be driving to some country church to preach and visit with eiderly members. He'd take the long way back home, drive 45 miles-per hour, and stop off for pie and ice cream along the

He'd spend his mornings working on the book he never finished, or maybe a sequel, and he'd harrass me to help him edit it. Come to think of it I'd probably be harrassing him to get out and sell my column to editors and publishers. He always was the best salesman I knew.

If he were around today, I'd introduce him to a special friend of mine. I'm pretty sure he'd fall in love with her, the same as I did.

I don't want this to sound like I'm complaining too much over my Dad's premature death. I did have him around for 32 years. Some kids don't have their's around for 32 days.

When I was growing up he was at every game, often just to watch me sit on the bench. He'd volunteer his car for school trips, and he'd say those public relations type prayers over the P. A. system while I was lined up on the kicking team waiting to go downfield and kill somebody.

After the high school football games, I'd go to a dance and wouldn't get home until the wee-morning hours. As soon as he heard the door open, though, I knew he'd come walking into the living room in his underwear - just so we could replay the game.

It's strange, I guess, but the picture I see most when I think of him, is one of a jolly round man walking through the park toward a picnic table with a watermelon over his shoulder. We had lots of

I can't help but wish I could have back one more evening with my old man. I'd catch him up on life in the eighties. We'd talk politics and sports. And I'd listen proudly while he bragged shamelessly on his grandkids.

I might even get around to mumbling a thank you while we watched the football game.


