We're not friends, really. We used to work together, though, and occasionally he'd ask me for advice, just so he could ignore it.

The truth is, the only ranch he comes off of is the one in his mind. When he called the other day he had resorted to washing dishes in a hotel. He is a cowboy though, and he's got the mud flaps and bumper stickers and tobaccostained teeth to prove it.

Cowboy may only weigh 125 pounds, but he's got 250 pounds worth of kick in his heart. "You don't ever want to mess with a cowboy." he warns. "You could get hurt - real bad."

So could Cowboy, unfortunately. Cowboy's girlfriend not only messed with one cowboy's heart - the one we've just been talking about - she gave the same heart to his best friend.

Cowboys aren't like the rest of us. If this was your girlfriend and she was taking up with your best friend, you might not have a best friend any longer.

Cowboys are different. Willie Nelson gave hint of this with his ballad, "Red-Headed Stranger."

"Well, you can't blame a man for killing a woman, who's trying to steal his horse," he told us, with enough conviction to get your sympathy, if not total agreement.

A cowboy's best friend is his best friend. Cowboys prop their boots on bumpers of pickup trucks and sandwich 25 words of speech into eight hours of spittin' and drinkin'. By slowing down speech patterns several RPMs, the dialogue has few conversational gaps.

The first step to a successful

preparation should include weed of seedbeds. control, plant residue breakdown, timely planting.

"Getting a uniform early stand land preparation the previous fall and winter," points out Metzer, a cotton specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System

One of the key practices associated with land preparation is to avoid working wet soil, Metzer emphasizes. Compacted zones or hard pans frequently can be traced back to working soil too wet. Unless these compacted zones are broken up, cotton roots may be limited to the upper 12 inches of soil.

New law allows tax

relief for some

Farmers with taxable income from debts discharged are eligible for some tax relief.

Such farmers will not have to wait until the new tax law takes

Under final language in the new law, the Internal Revenue Service will treat farm debt discharged after April 9, 1986, as if the farmer due to loss of soil sturctures often was insolvent. In general, that result when working soils that are means debt relief will reduce a poor soil structure. This leads to immediate tax bill, Hayenga


restructuring plan should now get it done before year-end, advises the economist. Also, a farmer can still benefit from the old 60 percent capital gain exclusion which will be eliminated after 1986.

If a farmer is insolvent before the restructuring, he can also avoid the alternative minimum tax on capital gain, adds Hayenga. This provision applies to any sale after 1981.

The new law lifts the statute of limitations on filing an amended return if a farmer is stuck with the alternative minimum tax for post-1981 sale while insolvent.

For further details relating to the taxable income from debts discharged and to the alternative minimum tax on capital gain. Hayenga advises producers to consult an accountant or tax specialist.
