By the 11th level of mailing, the entire population of the United States (almost 300 million) would be exhausted. By the 13th level, the population of the world (over 4 billion) would be exhausted. And remember, even if the chain letter itself is not mailed, as long as the payment or prize is sent through the mail, the entire scheme is illegal.
