Sales tax rebates down

Merkel's latest sales tax rebate figures show the town is doing this month and their rebates are better than the county average, running 4.74 off their 1986 pace. according to a news release from the State Comtroller's office.

The June rebates were \$2,000 behind while Tuscola's are down lower than last June's, but Merkel is still 11.32 percent behind in payments this year, compared to 1986 figures.

Merkel's latest check was for \$6,084.02, compared to \$3,996.69 in June, 1986. So far this year, Merkel has received \$34,093.98 sales tax rebates to 1,039 cities compared to \$38,444.55 through the same period last year.
