During archery season, he is capable, but he may not exceed the four deer limit in both archery and regular season Reaching the limit during archery season is difficult anyway, in spite of the 4 million plus deer population in Texas this year Texas Parks \& Wildife estimates the archery success rate between seven and ten percent annually. <br> By far the most popular system for bowhunting deer in Texas is stand hunting over feeders.
