



Beginning with pre-historic times to the first taming of fire, man's life span was only 40 years partly due to food poisons and contaminated food. After cooking was discovered, formerly indigestible foods became more edible. As great civilizations came to be, the main trade commodity of commerce between Egypt, Rome and Greece was food grains along with spices from the East. Mrs. Jay pointed out in these civilizations the contrast in living standards between the very rich

distribution of food, as today, was given away to relieve poverty. Thus, agriculture has always been the basic industry of civilization. It is well to remember that a large portion of the world's population is responsive to rural rather than urban conditions.




