increase of about \$28.5 million no matter what time of the month annually, which amounts to a 12.9 per cent average. The Company had filed last May for a \$50.4 million rate increase, which would have been a 23 per cent increase. Under the Commissions final order, the typical residential customer would see their bill increase by about \$7.24, or from \$43.95 to \$51.19. This is an average between the summer and winter
