The city has also taken great strides in the last couple of years in removing dilapidated homes from residential areas, as well as enforcing a local weed ordinance to control overgrown lots in the community.

His question concerning leadership here makes a valid point and I take it personally. I am the current Chamber of Commerce president and have held that post since last March.
