According to the American Cancer Society, one out of eleven women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime in her lifetime. it is currently estimated that over 37,000 women die each year as the result of breast

Ninety percent of breast cancers are diagnosed by women or their physicians finding a lump in the breast. Women who are diagnosed with a lump large enough to feel have a 50 percent five year survival rate. A woman who is diagnosed as having breast cancer by mammagraphy, before a lump can be felt, has a 97% five year survival rate and a 90% 10 year survival rate.

V. A symptomatic woman should have a mammagram at mass, nipple discharge, skin changes or unexplained breast

A screening mammagram is an x-ray of the breast using extremely low dosages of radiation (usually comparable to dental x-rays) and is designed to find very early cancers.

A female technologist who is highly trained in mammography will perform the examination.
