The public is invited to attend.

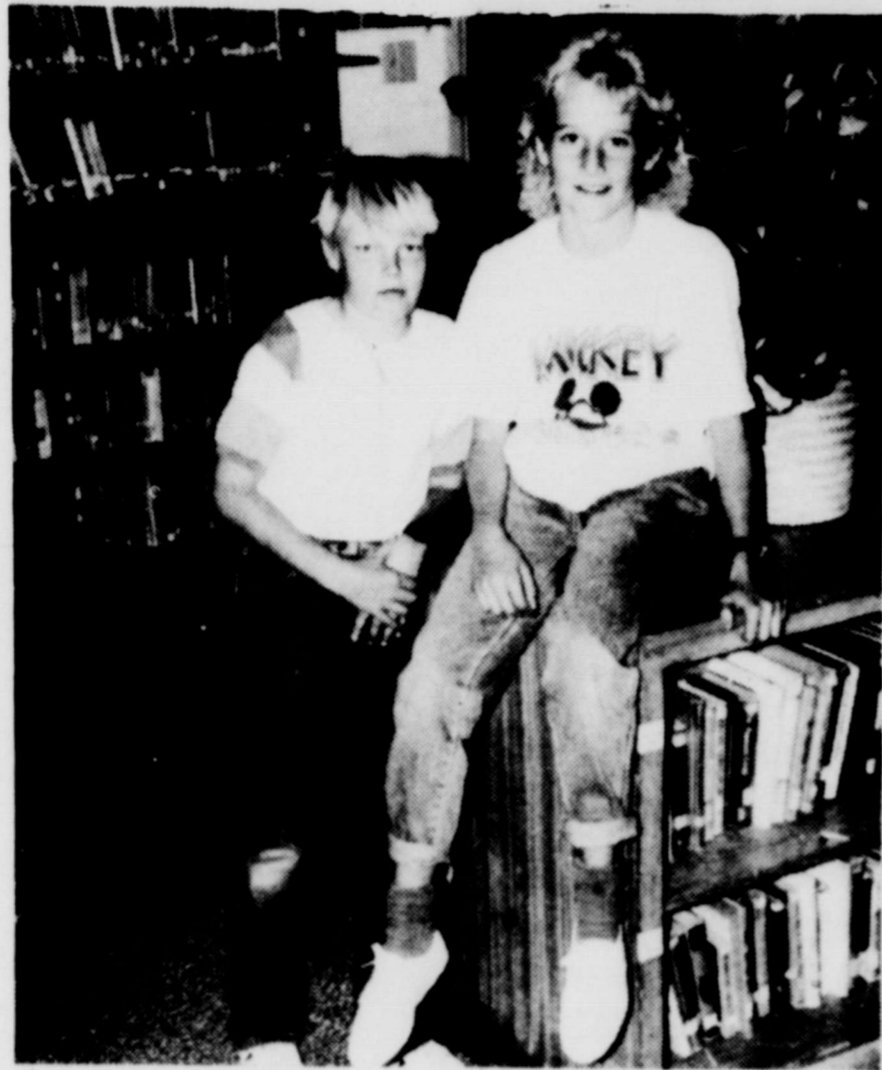
Merkel softball group sets registration through April 16

MISD looking for head coach

Coach Lepard asked last week to be reassigned. His contract, which is good through the 1988-89 school year, was not extended by the board at the February meeting.

His reassignment will be considered at the end of the school year.

IRS extensions explained

This week's topic will be extensions. If you run out of time and cannot get your return completed by April 15th, you can apply for an automatic four month extension. This gives you until August 15th to file your return.

To apply for this extension, you will need to fill out form 4868 and send it in to the IRS by April 15th. On this form, you will need to estimate your tax liability. In order to avoid the late payment penalty, you need to have 90% of your tax liability paid in by April 15th. Also, this extension does not stop any interest from accruing on any unpaid tax liability. It just gives you more time to file your return.

If you need still more time after August 15, you can apply for a final 2 month extension. This is done on form 2688 and must be filed by August 15. This gives you until October 15 to file and any return filed after this date may be subject to a late filing penalty as well as a late payment penalty.

Interest is charged on the tax not paid by the regular due date April 15, of the return until the tax is paid. It will be charged even if you have been granted an extension or show reasonable cause for not paying on time.

April 15 is also the due date of the first quarterly estimate payment for 1988. Individuals who have taxable income and are not having federal income tax withheld should make estimate payments to avoid an underpayment of estimated tax penalty. If you owe more than

\$500 and are not at least 90% paid in when you file your 1988 return you will be subject to this penalty. Form 1040ES has a worksheet that you can use to see if you need to make estimated tax payments.

This is my final article for the year. I hope these articles have been helpful to you in the preparation of your return. If you need any of the above mentioned forms, feel free to come by my office and I will provide you with them.
