Pack up the kids, take along a few lawn chairs and come enjoy the day. . . . . . .


Everyone but wheat farmers who are still trying to cut are probably tick-

Council members agreed to sell the league water at cost plus pumping charges. Merkel mayor pro tem Ted Smith said "We couldn't give raises to employees this year and I can't see asking the citizens to pay for water. As long as it doesn't cost the city anything we can sell it at cost."


