commissionersare expecting petitions calling for the election to be turned in during their next regular meeting on
Monday, October 25 . Once the petitions are turned in, the county will have 20 days to verify the
signatures on the petitions and then signatures on the petitions and then
another 90 days to call the election If ano rollback election is successful, the county will see a $\$ 157,000$ decrease in revenues. If this is the case, the
commissioners will have to commissioners will have to trim the

The court indicated it will wait until he results of the rollback effort are known before moving ahead and made it clear though, any decision the court makes would be subject to voter scrutiny. "We could have some more public hoarings, said the Judge. "I would
