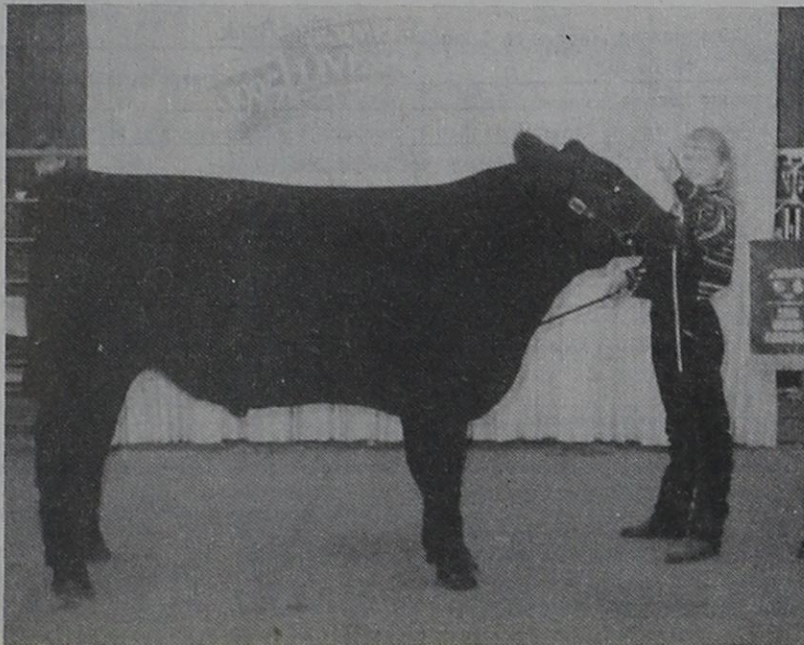

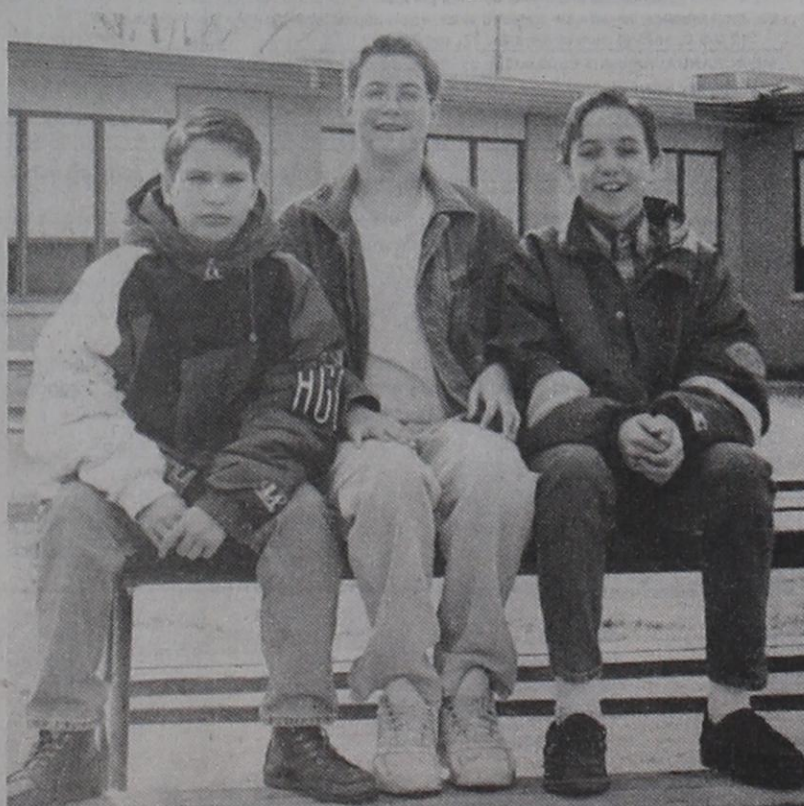

Winners In Parmer County Essay Contest

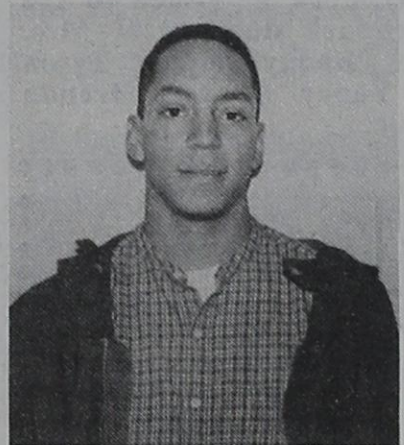
Each year the Soil and Water Conservation District sponsors an essay contest relating to conservation in Parmer County.

On Tuesday, January 17, three middle school band members competed in New Deal for the All-Region Band.

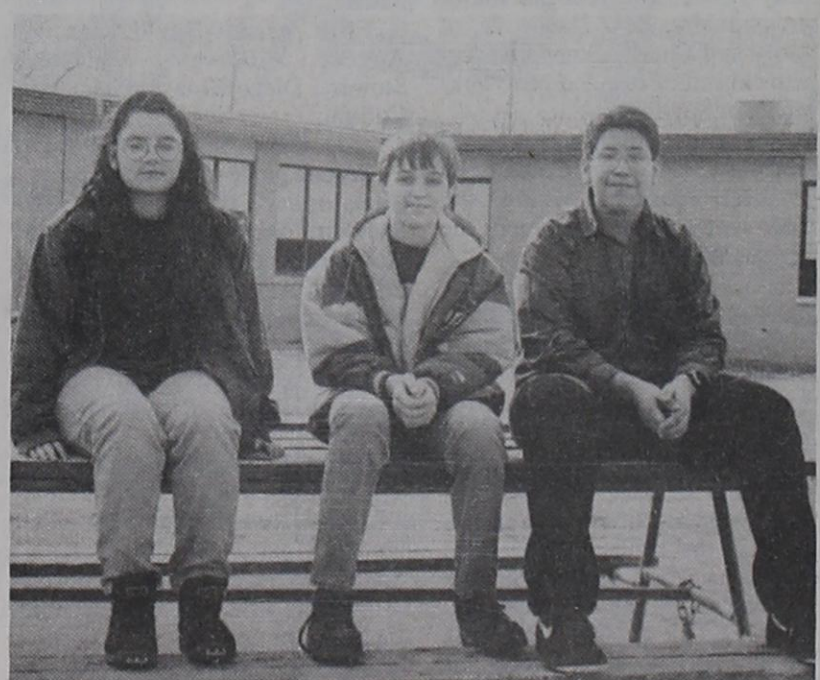

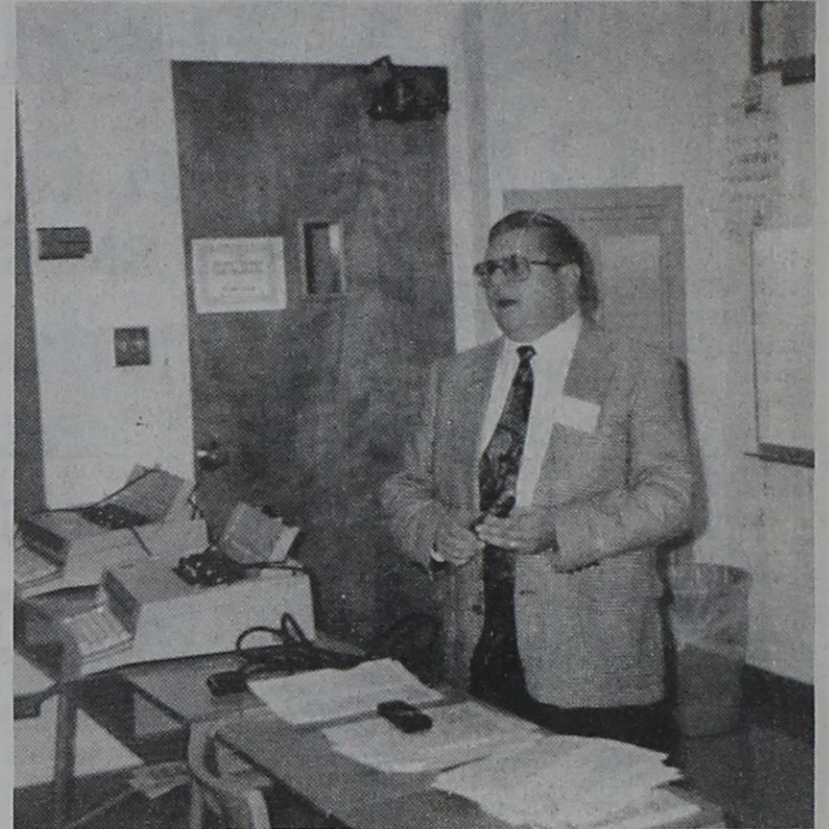

The week of activities was organized and sponsored by the Bovina ISD "District Improvement Team." Steve Venable acted as chairman of the "Get A Life!" week committee.



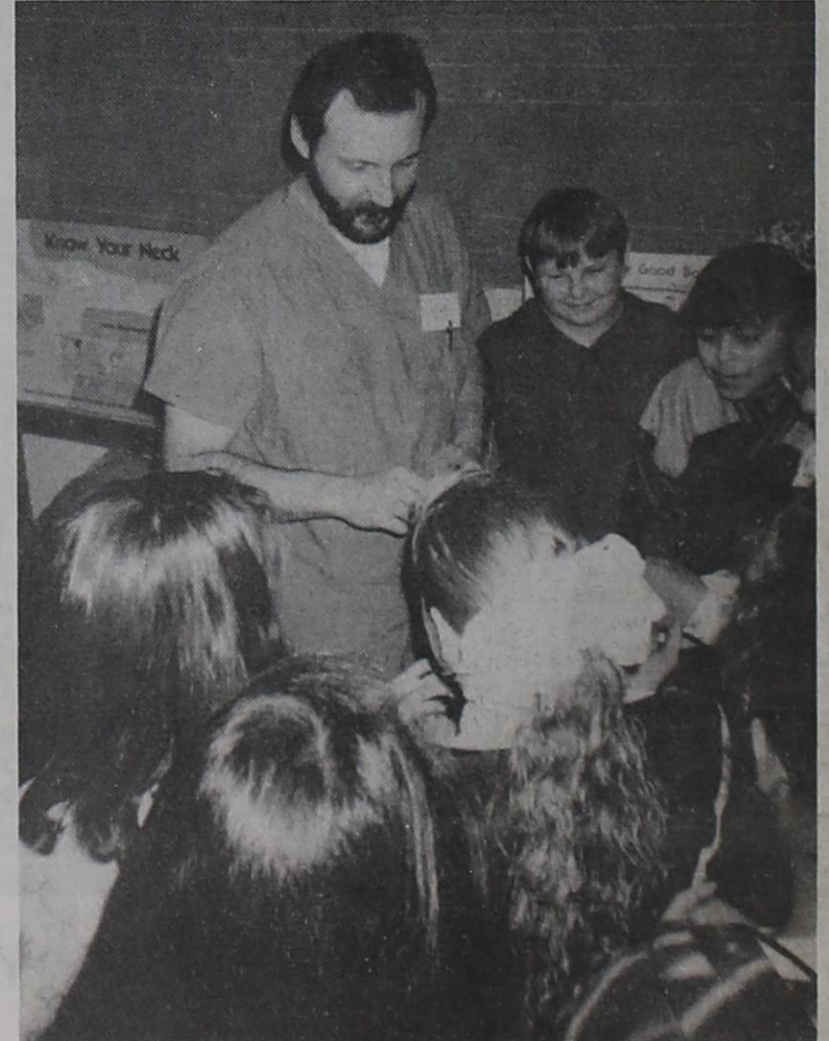

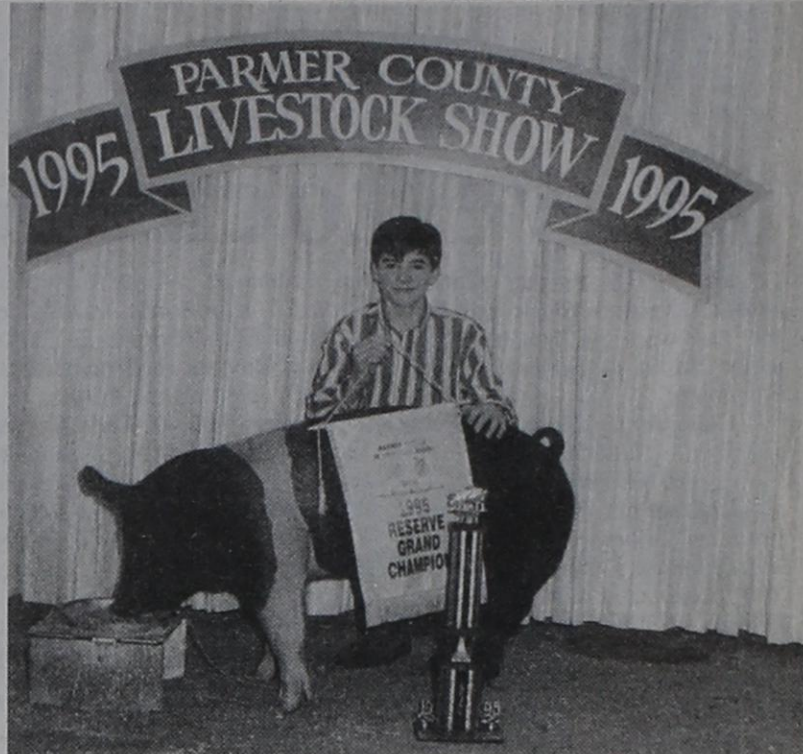

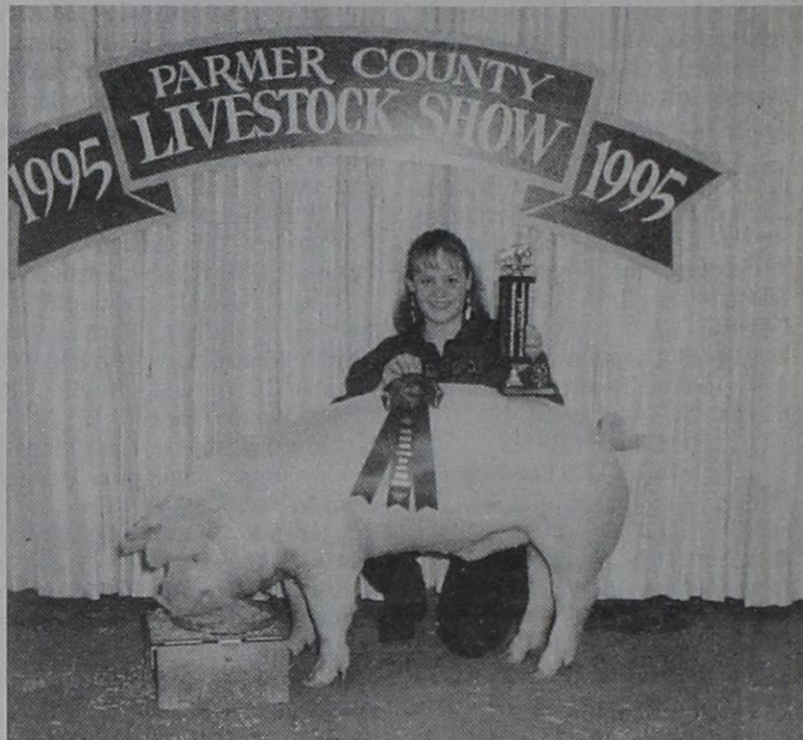

The Mexican food supper will begin at 6:30 p.m.

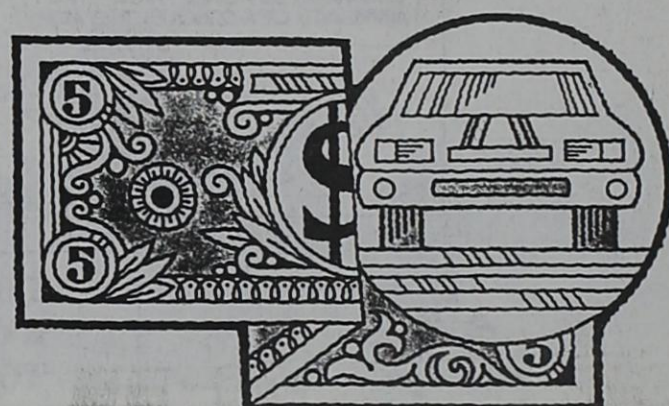

Police Department News

On January 11, 1995, two Bovina residents, one male and one female, were arrested by Bovina Police on warrants for "harassment." Both cases are pending action in the county court.

On January 16, 1995, a Clovis man was arrested by Bovina Police on a warrant for "escape." This stemmed from an incident which occurred in Bovina on January 14. This case is pending action by the next grand jury.

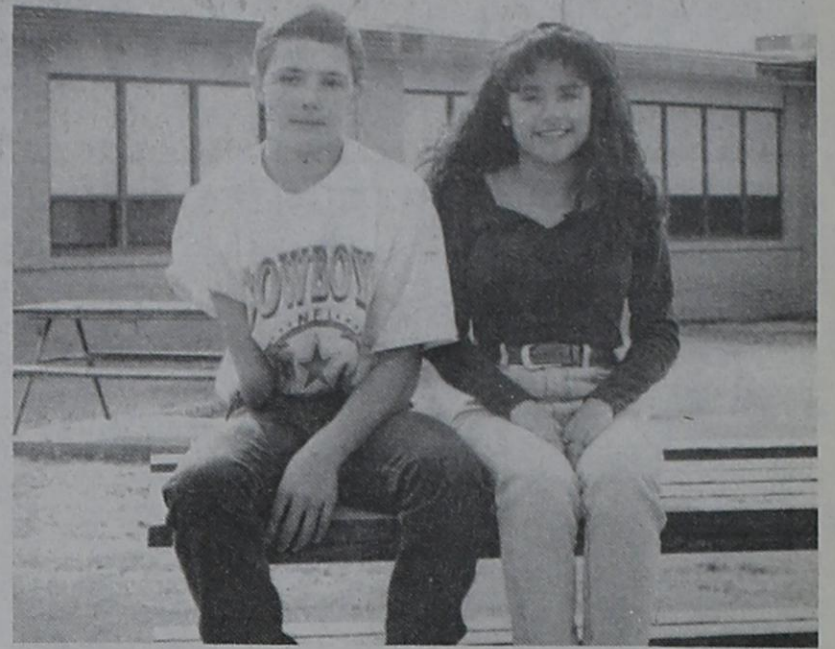
On January 19, 1995, an Amarillo woman was arrested by Bovina Police for possession of marijuana. The woman was a passenger in a car stopped for a traffic violation. The driver of the vehicle was cited and released. This case is pending in the county court.

On January 19, 1995, a Bovina

man was arrested by Bovina Police on a felony theft warrant from Bailey County. He was released after posting bond. The case is pending in the district court.

On January 22, 1995, a Longview couple was arrested by Bovina Police. The man was arrested for felony revocation of probation and the woman was arrested for theft by check. Both of these charges were from Gregg County. The woman was later released on bond from the Parmer County Jail. The man was awaiting transfer to Gregg County.

In 1994, the Bovina Police Department had 96 offense/incident's reported. Of these all but 11 were cleared.



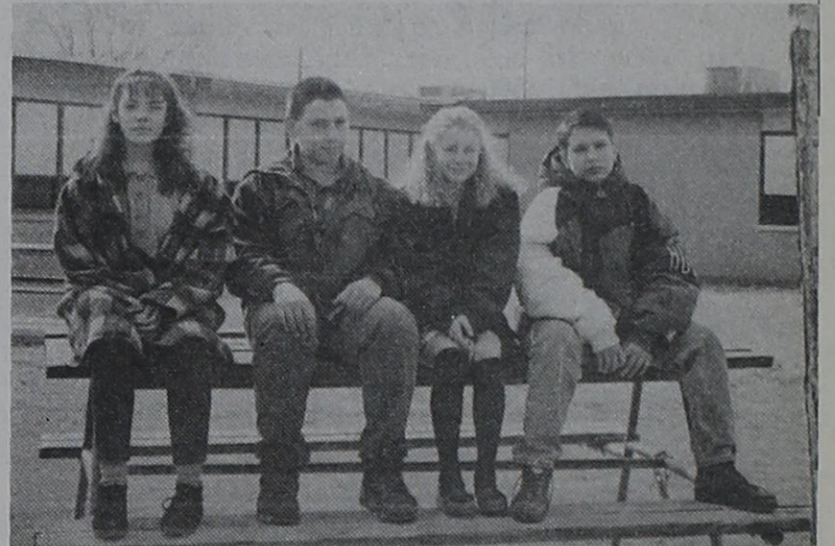

Reyna scored 12 points, Perez 10, Nieto eight, Quintana four.

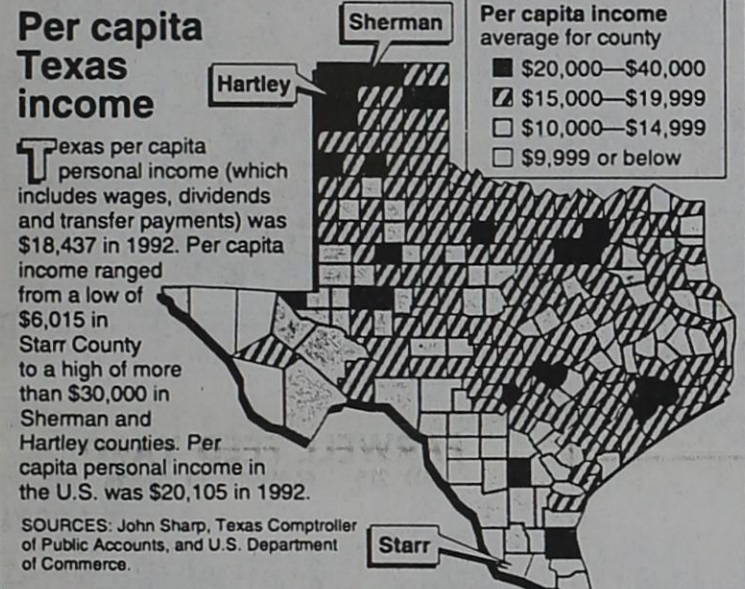
The Bovina girls Junior Varsity beat Sudan, the final score being 52-33.

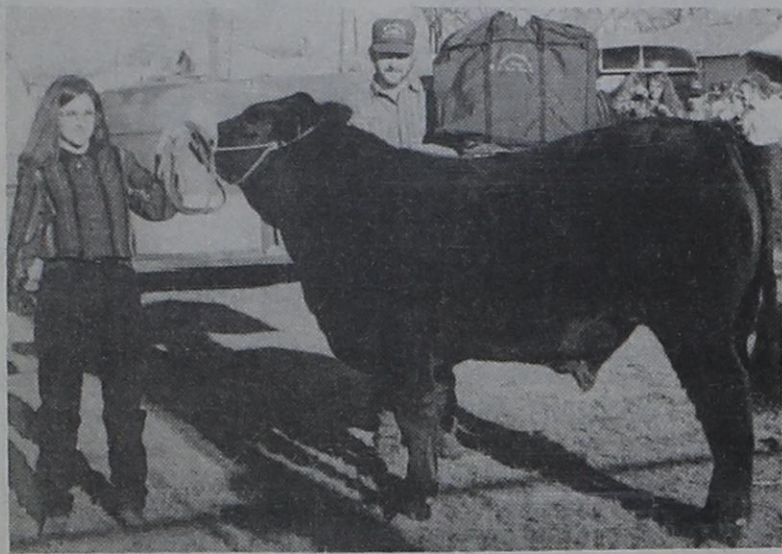

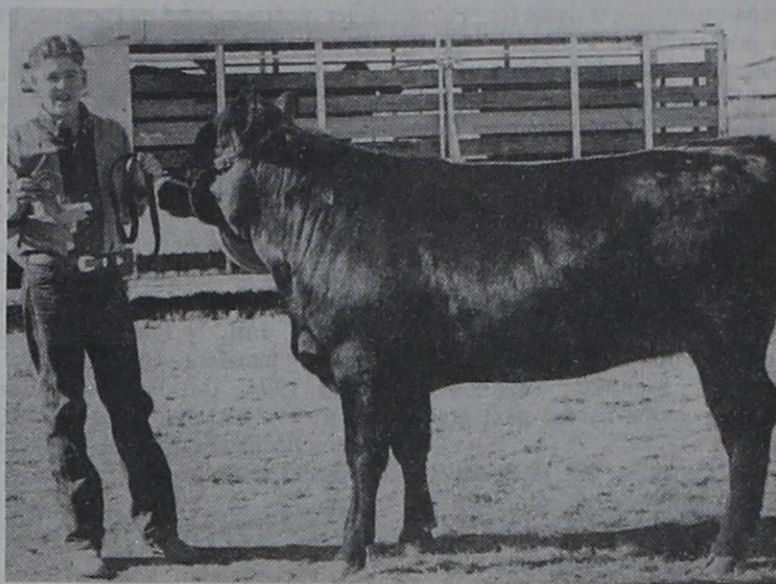

GRAND CHAMPION STEER...D'Anne Jones is shown here with her steer that was named Grand Champion at the Bovina Junior Livestock Show recently.



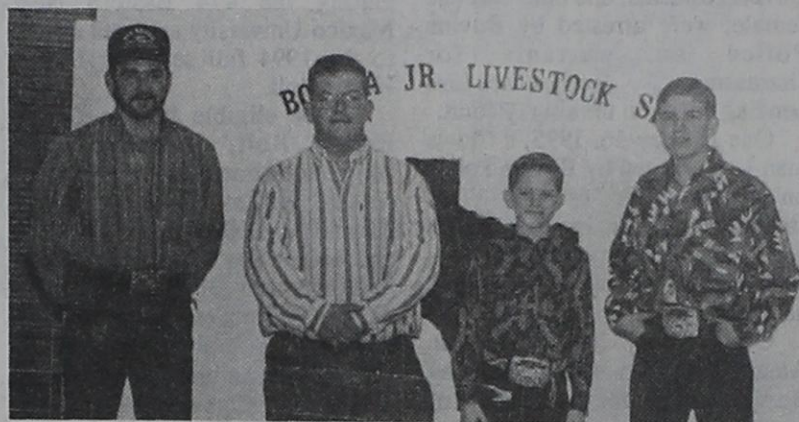

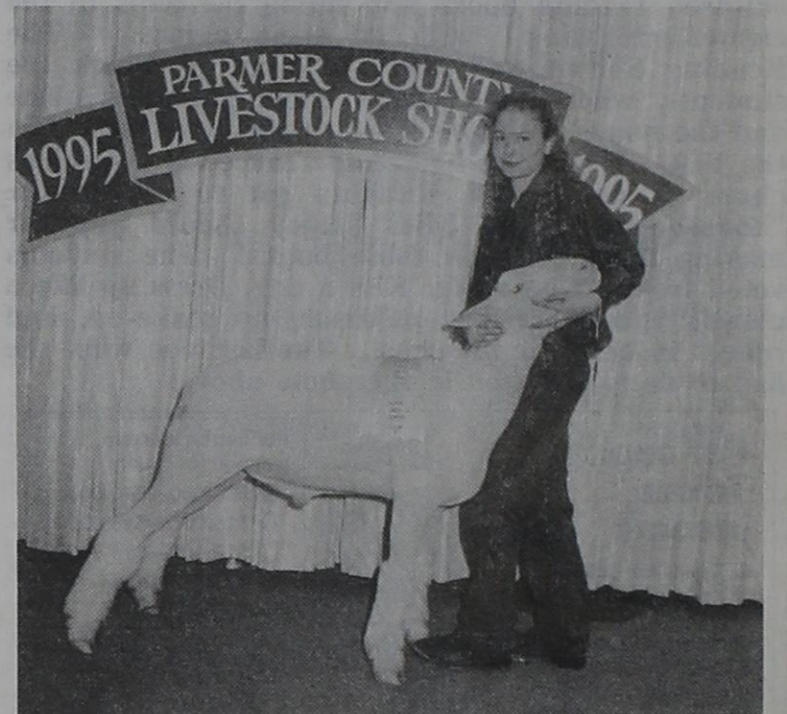

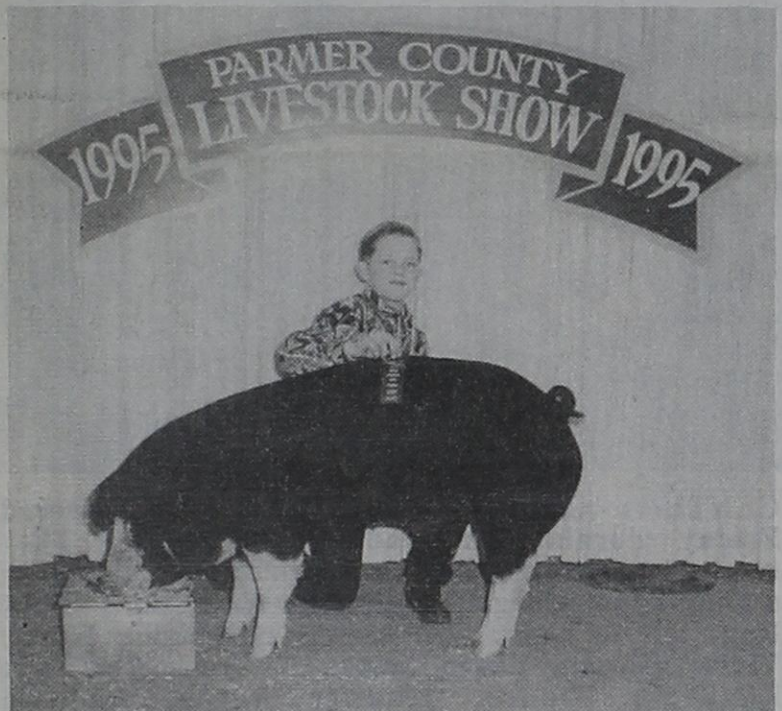

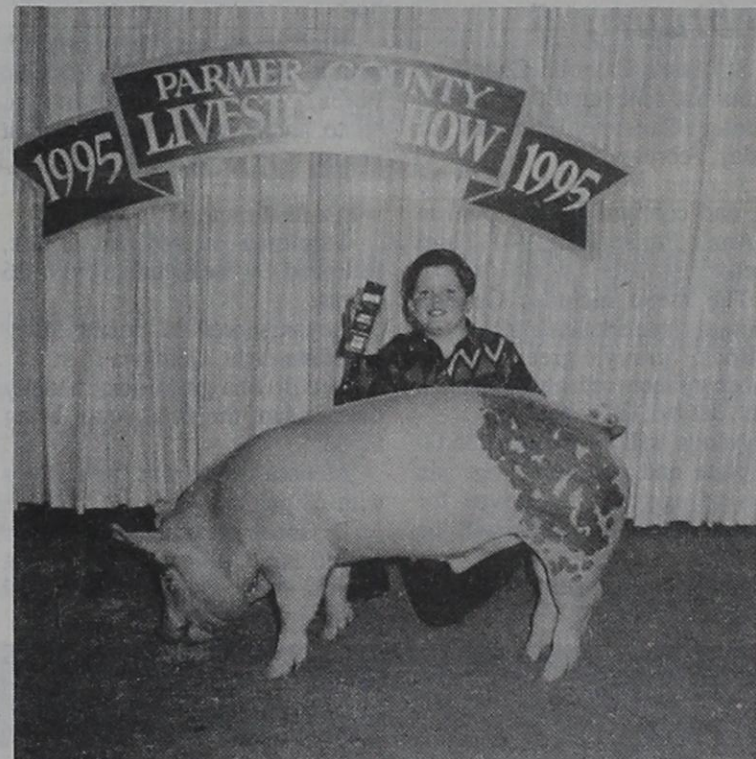

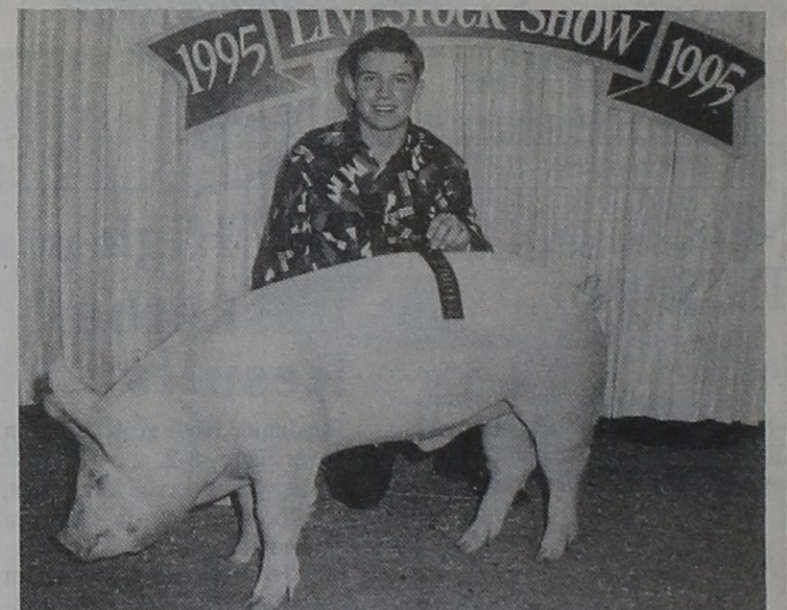
