Throwing the poor a leaden life preserver


You may think these analogies are inappropriate, and you're right. Telling the sun where to direct its rays wouldn't do any good,
but tit also wouldn't do any harm. Raising the minimum wage, alas, isn't merely useless. It will produce plenty of damage, including lost
jobs, that its supporters. prefer to ignore. The Clinton administration tirelessly cites a single study
purporting to show that employment actually increased in California purporting to show that employment actualy increased in California
and New Jersey fast-food restaurants after those states lifted their
wage floors. The study sumgested that if you charge more for wage floors. The study suggested that if you charge more for
unskilled labor, employers will want more of it. Does that make sense? If it did, going-out-of-business sales would
feature big price hikes. Magazine subscription offers would invite readers to pay double the newsstand price. Credit card companies
would offer special "teaser interest rates of 30 percent annually. And apples falling off trees would soar into outer space.
No one can truly doubt that jobs will vanish if the minimum wage
rises. Some workers don't produce enough to iustify a $\$ 5.15$ an hour rises. Some workers don't produce enough to justify a $\$ 5.15$ an hour
wage, and a higher minimum wage makes it illegal for those people Congress and the White House think those employees are better
off not working than working for a demeaning level of pay. But inexperienced young people who can't find minimum-wage jobs as a
result of this measure may lose more than one iob - they may never get on the employment ladder at all. Unskilled people are better off working at low-paying jobs, which prepare them for higher-paying jobs, than
idling on the street corner.
The side effects don't end with eroding the job base. Workers lucky enough to find jobs payying the new minimum wage will find it harder
to get fringe benefits, as employers try to offset the new expense. A
fast-food cashier or office janitor might be better off with $\$ 4.25$ an
hour with medical coverage than $\$ 5.15$ without. Today, employers hour with medical coverage than $\$ 5.15$ without. Today, employers
and employees are free to make that deal. Tomorrow, they won't be.
Trying to help poor people by raising the minimum wage is like Trying to help poor people by raising the minimum wage is like
trying to help them by putting price controls on bread, rent and trying to help them by putting price controls on bread, rent and
gasoline. In the first place, it spreads many or most of its benefits
around to people who are not poor: Alot of minimum-wa around to people who are not poor: A lot of minimum-wage workers
are teen-agers from middle-class families, not single mothers struggling to support three kids.
In the second place, it tends to backfire. Fixing the price of fuel was supposed to assure cheap gasoline, but it also produced maddening
shortages and long lines at the pump We learned the folly of price shortages and long lines at the pump We learned the folly of price
controls on gasoline; we have yet to learn the folly of price controls Supporters of the increase claim we will reap big welfare savings since higher wages will lift some recipients out of poverty. But while
some workers may see their earnings go from $\$ 4.25$ an hour to $\$ 5.15$
an hour others will see their earnings go from $\$ 4.25$ an hour to $\$ 0.00$ n hour. The legislation on Capitol Hill isn't the looniest attempt to repeal
he laws of economics. Baltimore and Milwaukee have passed "living wage" ordinances that require e a super-minimum wage for companies
seeking municipal contracts, and other cities seeking municipal contracts, and other cities may follow suit,
Baltimore's pay floor is $\$ 6.10$ an hour, rising to $\$ 7.70$ an hour in 1998 All across America, big-city mayors arelamenting their inadequate
resources and trying to avoid drivin out middle-class tapayers. Yet these ordinances force them to pay more without getting more. As a
result, they'll have to raise taxes or cut back on services, encouraging their residents to head for the suburbs.
This apprach makes it harder for cities to trim budgets by privatizing some functions, like garbage collection. Private companie unions, which might explain why municipal employee unions are
enchanted by the idea. Contractors will be encouraged to hire skilled workers and fire unskilled ones.

name of good or evil. We have them because of public ignorance about their effects and because politicians are guided more by expediency

You'd tell him to go play in the traffic, hire the three low-skille workers for $\$ 39$ and still have the 100 yards of fence built. The highskilled worker knows youd do that. So before going into your office,
he will go o Congress and plead that those low-skilled workers are
being exploited and need a living wage. He might call for Congress After the enactment of the $\$ 20$-a-day minimum wage, the highAfter the enactment of the $\$ 20-$ a-day minimum wage, the high-
skilled workeris in a better position toget away with demanding $\$ 55$
per day because it now costs you $\$ 60$ to employ the low-skilled per day because it now costs you $\$ 60$ to employ the low-skilled
workers. The high-skilled worker has used Congress to price his
competition out of the market. Whether the call for higher minimum wages is motivated by greed or benevolence is unimportant. Its effect
is to make low-skilled workers economically less attractive. Congressmen know these minimum-wage effects. So, why do many
of them support raising it? The answer is simple. Teen-agers are the primary victims of minimum wages. No congressman or senator
owes his seat to the teen-age vote, ,ut many do owe their seats to the you dump on people who can't dump back on you. workers; it is one of the most effective tools in the arsenals of racists everywhere. Gert Beetge, the secretary of South Africas avowedy
racist Building Worker's Union, once complained "There is no job
reservation lett in the building industry, and in the circumstances,

- I support the rate for the job (South Africa's version of minimum wages) as the second best way of protecting our white artisans.
A year later, Beetge stated that he would be "prepared to allow
black artisans into the industry provided that minimum wages were raised from Rand 1,40 to at least Rand 2,00 per hour." South Africa's racists have always supported minimum wages for blacks, and we
can respect at least their honesty. They openly stated that their
motivation was to protect white workers from competition with motivation was
black workers.
