 planting for protection from erosio is the major reason for conservation tillage. Examples of conservation tillage include no-till, non-inversion tillage, and strip tillage. No-till consists of planting in used to kill growing crops after harvest and control weeds. Non-inversion tillage consists of using sweeps or chisels to kill growing crops following harvest and retain
residues on the surface. Succeeding crop is planted in remaining residue which is adequate for protection from erosion. Herbicides may be used in this system to aid in the control of weeds. Strip tillage system consists of preparing a seedbed no wider than in which to plant the succeeding crop in the previous crop's residue. Twothirds of the area is left untilled with
