The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in
breast cancer detection, teaching of breast cancer detection, teaching of
breast self-examination and a mammogram. Currently, the most effective
method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done
by following the guidelines recomby following the guidelines recom-
mended by the American Cancer mended by the American Cancer
Society for breast screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer. The guidelines are: (1) Learn and
perform breast self-examination; perform breast self-examination; (2) Have a physical examination every
year; (3) Have a mammogram year; (3) Have a mammogram
according to the recommendations by age. Age $35-40$, one baseline mammogram; $40-50$, a mammogram every $1-2$ years; over 50 yearly mammograms.
