Would we not say that these judicial decisions are straight to the

secured by the Constitution are involved, there can be no rule making
or legislation which would abrogate them." - Miranda v. Arizona, 384 US 436,491 , "The claim and exercise of a constitutional right cannot
be converted into a crime." - Miller v. US, 230 F 486,489 .
"There can be no sanction or penalty imposed upon one because of this exercise of constitutional rights." - Sherer v. Cullen, 481 F 945 .
There is no question that a citationt/icket issued by a police officer,

insurance, etc., which carries a fine or jail time, is a penalty or sanction, and is indeed "converting a right into a crime".
