disease. No effective treatments are available once the animal is
affected, so prevention is the affected, so prevention is the be
weapon to protect your horse. Since vaccines afford protection for only one year, annual revaccina-
tion is recommended tion is recommended. Veterinarians
can provide information on the proper vaccine and procedure for
this vaccination. At the time vaccination, a tetanus toxoid shot can be given in a combined vaccine
to protect the horse or colt against tetanus as well.
Since mosquitoes are mainly
responsible for spreading sleeping sickness, it's important to vaccinate
horsses before the mosquito season
