Two Post businesses were surprised Wednesday morning when they arrived at work finding their offices burglarized.

The Post Dispatch news office and the Lynn-Garza Farm Bureau office, both located on east Main Street, both reported break-ins occurred the previous evening or in the early morning hours.

A Macintosh computer and a Canon camera were all reported stolen from the news office. The burglars also made off with about \$200 cash. In all the missing items totaled about \$3,200. A computer monitor was also smashed in, but no other vandalism was reported.

At the Lynn-Garza County Farm Bureau office, officials reported a saw was stolen and a fire extinguisher was used in the back causing damages.

Garza County Sheriff's Department officials are investigating the break-ins.




Despite his quick exit, the memorable Fritz left a legacy: appearance first, taste second.

USDA RESPONDS TO PRO-DUCER CONCERNS BY EXTENDING SIGN-UP DATE FOR DCP AND ACRE PROGRAMS

(POST,TX), March 31, 2009 Victor Ashley, Executive Director of USDA's Farm Service Agency in Garza-Borden Counties announced today that USDA has extended the sign-up deadline from June 1, to Aug. 14, 2009, for both the Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) and the forthcoming Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program. This action extends the sign-up deadline by 10 weeks to give producers ample time to decide whether to participate in ACRE or remain in DCP.

"Extending the sign-up deadline for both these programs ensure that America's farmers have enough information and time needed to determine if ACRE is the right program for their operational needs," said Ashley. "The DCP and ACRE programs play a critical role in the farm safety net and it is vital that we act to support the hard work of the farmers we depend on."

Sign-up for ACRE is expected to start in late April, with an official sign-up announcement to be made in the coming weeks. Producers can elect ACRE at their FSA county office after the sign-up period commences. The original June 1 deadline may have forced producers to rush their decision, which is why this extension gives producers more time to make an informed decision about staying with DCP for 2009 or participating



in ACRE for crop year 2009 and beyond through 2012.

The ACRE program, authorized by the 2008 Farm Bill, provides eligible producers a statelevel revenue guarantee, based on the 5-year state Olympic average yield and the 2-year national average price. ACRE payments are made when both state and farmlevel triggers are met. By participating in ACRE, producers elect to forgo counter-cyclical payments, receive a 20-percent reduction in direct payments and a 30-percent reduction in loan rates. The decision to elect ACRE binds the farm to the program through the 2012 crop year, the last crop year covered by the 2008 Act.

A scale, calculator and tape measure are all you need By Russell A. Graves

For as long as anyone can remember, deer hunters have judged their trophies against one another by touting a buck's Boone & Crockett score. Did you know that turkey hunters can also get in on the game of keeping harvest records and do a little bragging along the way? That's right. With a few simple measurements, you can objectively evaluate a turkey and assign it a "score" by using a set of systematic measurements.



The tools needed for scoring a turkey are simple: a spring scale capable of weighing a hanging object; a flexible, 1/4-inch-wide tape measure for measuring the spur and beard length, and a calculator for completing the calculations. If you have Internet access, you can skip the calculations by logging on to the National Wild Turkey Federation's Web site at (www.nwtf.org) and use their online scoring calculator. First step

To get started, you'll need to weigh your turkey and convert the ounces to decimal form. The conversion formula is simple. All you need to do is divide the ounces by 16. For example, if your turkey weighs 22 pounds and 5 ounces, then to convert the five ounces to decimal form, you'll divide 5 by 16, which



gives you .3125. Then combine the decimalounce equivalent with the number of pounds. In this case, we'll have the weight of 22.3125 pounds. Spurs

The next step is to measure the spurs and convert the fractional inch measurement to decimal form and measure to the nearest 1/16th-inch without reduction. In decimal form, 1/16-inch is equivalent to .0625. Using these numbers as a base, you can easily figure out the decimal equivalent to fractions. For example, to convert 3/16-inch, just multiply three times .0625.

Measure the spurs from where they

exit the leg and over the outside edge of the spur.

Once the spurs are measured, add the length of both spurs together and multiply by 10. For example, suppose the right spur measures 2-6/16 inches and the left spur measures 2-1/16 inches. The math will look like this:

2.3759 (right spur) + 2.0625 (left spur) = 4.4384 (total length of both spurs) 4.4384 X 10 = 44.384 (spur score)

Don't forget the beard

The last thing to measure on the turkey is the beard. Starting where the beard protrudes from the breast, measure along the center of the beard to the longest tip. Like on the spurs, convert the fractional


