Is It Too Easy for America to Go to War?

think about an alarming fact: Fewer than 1 percent of us are being called to fight in our current wars, in Afghanistan and Iraq New York Times columnist Bob Herbert has thought about it, and he calls it "obscene." Herbert goes on to produce one of the most important and brutally honest op-ed piece I've read in a long time

Herbert relates a story that says a lot about how many Americans have come to
I spoke recently with a student at Columbia who was enthusiastic about the escalation of U.S. forces in Afghanistan. He argued that a full-blown counterinsurgency effort, which would likely take many years and cost many lives, was the only way to truly win the war. He was a very bright young man: thought-
ful and eager and polite. I asked him if he had ful and eager and polite. I asked him if he had
any plans to join the military and help make any plans to join the military and help mat
this grand mission a success. He said no. this grand mission a success.
It's easy to be enthusiastic about a that you know you'll never have to take part in. In fact, most Americans know they won't have to sacrifice at all, and Herbert says that is dangerous for any society. The air is filled with obsessive self-satisfied rhetoric about supporting the troops, giving them everything they need and not letting
them down. But that rhetoric is as hollow a jazzman's drum because the overwhelming majority of Americans have no desire at all to share in the sacrifices that the service members and their families are making. Most Americans do not want to serve in the wars, do not want to give up their precious time to do volunteer work that would aid the nation's warriors and their families, do not even want
