## Recent Drug Bust on US-84 Yields Handgun, Cash, Drugs


#### Abstract

Truilllo's youngest daughter Angelita (5). Trujillo's youngest daughter Angelita (5).
Trujillo's assassination in 1961, after a $30-$ year reign, paved the way for the Dominican Republic to take back their country with a new government.
